News Bits

THE ENTIRE TRIBAL DEPARTMENTS have been busy working on their 1980 budgets for the past month. At this point the budgets have been turned in to the Branch Managers for review. It appears that everything is going right on schedule.

LARRY CALICA, DIRECTOR OF THE Health, Probation and Welfare Department has turned in his resignation effective July 31, 1979. Calica will devote his time serving his term on the Tribal Council. Replacing Calica will be Sal Sahme.

CODY LOGGING AND CONSTRUCTION CO. is doing seal coating on the road to the top of Kuckup grade. The construction started on July 20, near Warm Springs. This is a continuation from last

year as cold weather conditions forced them to stop last year. FROM HEAD START TO PARENTS who plan to send their children to HeadStart in September of this year should arrange to have their child's physical and dental exams done in July and August. A limited number of physicals are being accepted each day. Appointments should be set up as soon as possible. The phone number is 553-1196. It is a requirement that all children have a physical before entering Headstart.

WIC HAS NOW STARTED USING the new computer printed vouchers. They are in a different form compared to the old ones used in the past, but an explanation will be given on the use of these forms. The schedule and color codes are the same.
