As part of a Federal Energy Regulation Commission requirement, a panel of three engineers directly responsible to the Tribal Council has been appointed to the consulting board for the Tribes' hydroelectric project. The board members were selected for the Tribes through project engineer Jerry Dibble and

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Portland General Electric. They are James G. Patrick, Harold Stuart and Wayne Stewart, three of the foremost engineers around, according to Administrative Branch Manager Doug McClelland.

The purpose of the board is to review project planning and design and to insure construction of a safe and high-quality structure. Their goal is to help complete the project in the minimum time at the least cost commensurate with uncompromising safety and high standards of performance, according to McClelland.

School lunch policy announced

The Jefferson County School District 509-J has announced its policy for free and reduced-price meals for children unable to pay the full price of meals served under the National School Lunch program.

Local school officials have adopted the following family size income criteria for determining eligibility.

Children from families whose income is at or below the levels shown are eligible for free meals, or reduced-price meals. In addition families not meeting these criteria but with other unusual expenses, due to unusually high medical expenses, shelter costs in excess of 30 percent of income, special education expenses due to the mental or physical condition of a child, and disaster or casualty losses, are urged to apply.

Application forms are being sent to all homes in a letter to parents. Additional copies are available at the school office. The information provided on the application is confidential and will be used only for the purpose of determining eligibility. Applications may be submitted at any time during the year.

In certain cases foster children are also eligible for these benefits. If families have foster children living with them and wish to apply for such meals for them, they should contact the school.

Under the provision of that policy, the building principal will review applications and determine eligibility. If a parent is dissatisfied with the ruling of the official, he may wish to discuss the decision with the determining official on any informal basis. If he wishes to make a formal appeal, he may make a request either orally or in writing to the hearing official, Dr. Ernest Weber, 1355 Buff Street, Madras,

Oregon 97741, 475-6192, for a hearing to appeal the decision. The policy contains an outline of the hearing procedure.

If a family member becomes unemployed or if family size changes, the family should file a new application. Such changes may affect the eligibility of the children.

If the administration of school food service programs, no child will be discriminated against because of race, sex, color, or national origin.

Each school and the office of the superintendent has a copy of the complete policy which may be reviewed by any interested party.
