is proposed in the branch. Presently purchasing department supervisor Les Yaw has assumed the contracting officer's duties. But it is felt that to alleviate staffing problems in that department, a special contract department is necessary. This can save 10 percent of the construction costs if the Tribe carry their own contracts. There will be no need to purchase building bonds if the Tribe is its own contractor.

Total net budget increase is 35 percent.

### ADMINISTRATIVE BRANCH

The 1980 budget sees only one-and-a-half new positions being proposed. Data processing is requesting another programmer and the accounting department is requesting that a part-time employee be placed in full-time status.

Beginning Monday, September 24, Tribal Council will again review the budgets, eliminating what they feel are unnecessary items and any extreme spending. After this review, the approved budget will be posted for 30 days and in early November. General Council meetings will be held to discuss the 1980 budget.
