Cultural/Heritage Coordinator (full-time) Education Department Negotiable

Supervise all planning, implementation, operation and evaluation of the Cultural/Heritage Program to provide an education program for Tribal members to understand and respect traditional customs and values, encourage members to teach and learn traditional ceremonies, customs and values, emphasizing the survival of Indian heritage. Make available to outside groups and educational program of the Confederated Tribes' heritage. High school diploma or equivalent. Prefer college graduate. Must have knowledge of traditional customs and values equivalent to five years knowledge and experience, and demonstrated abilities in communication, reading and writing, human relations, understanding and appreciation of traditional backgrounds related to the development of educational materials.

Kah-Nee-Ta Security Police Department \$1,198/month

Must be 21 years of age or older, in sound physical condition and of sufficient size and strength to perform duties required. Must have High School diploma or equivalent. Must have never been convicted of any misdemeanor or felony for a period of one year prior to appointment. One year law enforcement experience. Must have a valid Oregon driver's license.

Supervisory and case management of probationers and Parole & Probation staff. Position requires familiarity with Tribal Court systems, other courts and resource agencies. Duties involve working with Native American people. High School diploma with at least three (3) years experience in working with Native American people in corrections setting or Bachelor's Degree in Corrections or Social Science. Valid driver's/chauffeur's license required.

Recreation Counselor (part-time) Family & Children Services Negotiable

High School graduate or equivalent with two years experience working with adolescents. Must have a valid Oregon driver's license and be able to obtain a chauffeur's license. Part-time evening and week-end work—approximately 20 hours per week. Duties require planning and executing recreation for residents of the Group Home which require the ability to deal with adolescents, plan recreation, educational and cultural needs.

Water Master Natural Resources \$12,935 - \$17,500

Basic engineering skills required relating to water measurement and one year of related experience. Duties require overall administration of the Tribes water management plan including developing procedures, recording individual rights to use water and rights to dispose of wastes in waterways; inspecting water usage and waste disposal; developing and maintaining data on water flow and yield for watersheds; regularly measuring diversions from streams and regulating to conform to established allocations.
