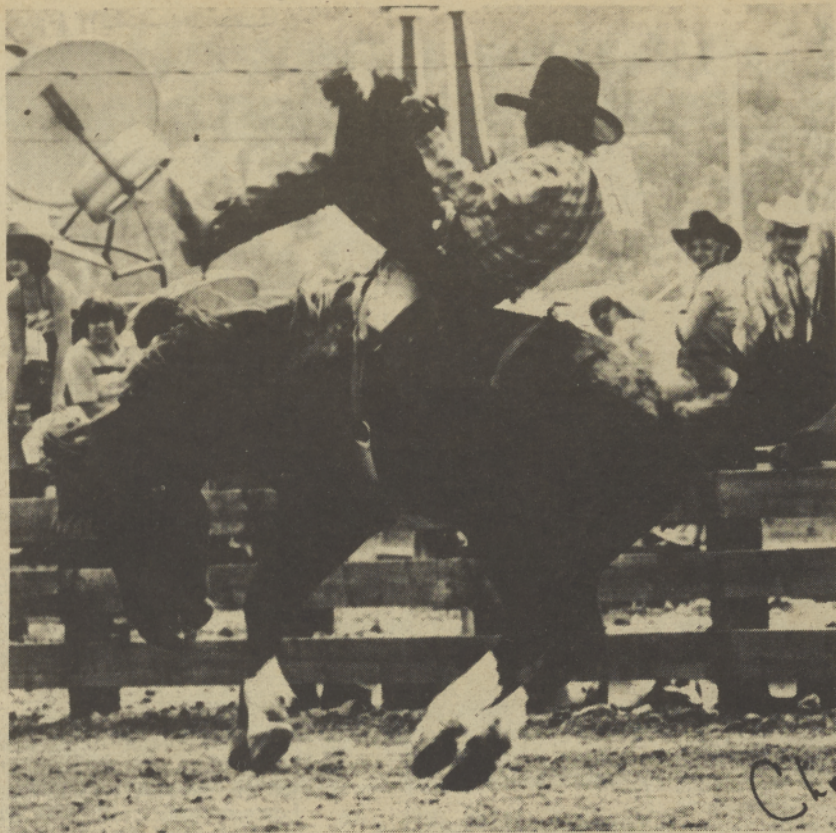
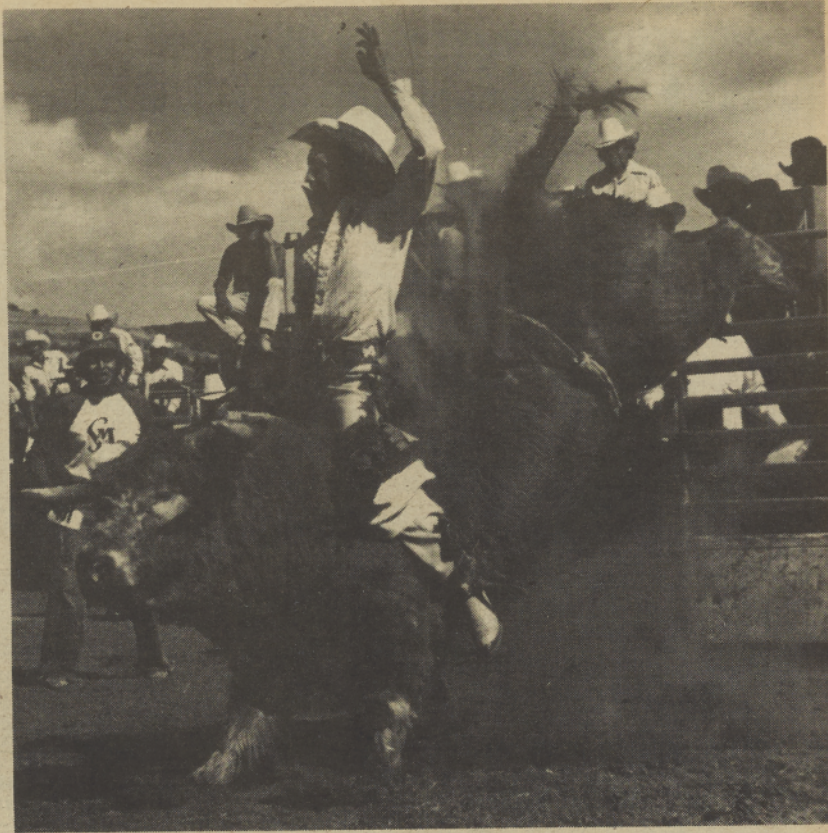

On to the National Finals

The Western States Indian Rodeo Association closed out another season and after all points were totaled and the standings posted, showed that two local cowboys earned a trip to the National Finals rodeo which will be staged in the Salt Palace at Salt Lake City, Utah from November 21 to the 24th.

Qualifying in the bareback riding event was Leland Tom. In the final standings for the year he was sitting second with the total points amounting to \$1,295.18. Leland's total was just \$441.26 lower than the winner for the year, Roy Begody. Vince Garcia placed third.

Ted Hurtado finished out the season in 3rd place in the bull riding with his total points of \$1,335.62 which was good enough to give him a spot in the finals in that event. Dave and Duane Best from Omak, Washington placed first and second respectively, with total points of \$2,460.87 and \$1,741.20.

In other events and representing the WSIRA at the finals, in the Saddle Bronc Jerry Sam, Oliver Louis and Dave Best placed first second and third to participate in the finals. The top three in the other events are as follows: in the steer wrestling Ron Bird,

H.C. Gilham and Pete Bruisehead are the representatives; calf roping winners are Les Reynolds, Melvin Joseph and Garret Spoonhunter. Other representatives in the wild cow milking are Wes Williams, Fred Kinerson Jr., and Melvin Joseph. Barrel Racing finalists are Ronda Herrera, Catherine Williams and Connie Sam. Team roping finalists are the Fred Williams team, Fred Kinerson Jr. team and the Wes Williams team.

At the finals each contestant representing his area from throughout country will be competing against the nation's best. Here the chips are down and all contenders are hoping for that world's championship title. Rodeo is one of the most dangerous but exciting sports in the world today.

There will be a fund-raising dinner sponsored by the Warm Springs Rodeo Association to help off-set expenses for the two cowboys who are representing Warm Springs at the National Finals Rodeo. The time and place for the fund-raising dinner is at the Agency Longhouse, 5 p.m. November 17. It is quite probable that everyone will be pulling for the local boys at the finals this year, so feel free to attend the fund-raising dinner.
