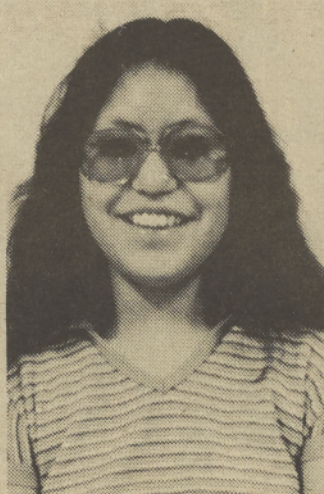


# Holiday Tournament Queen Candidates
