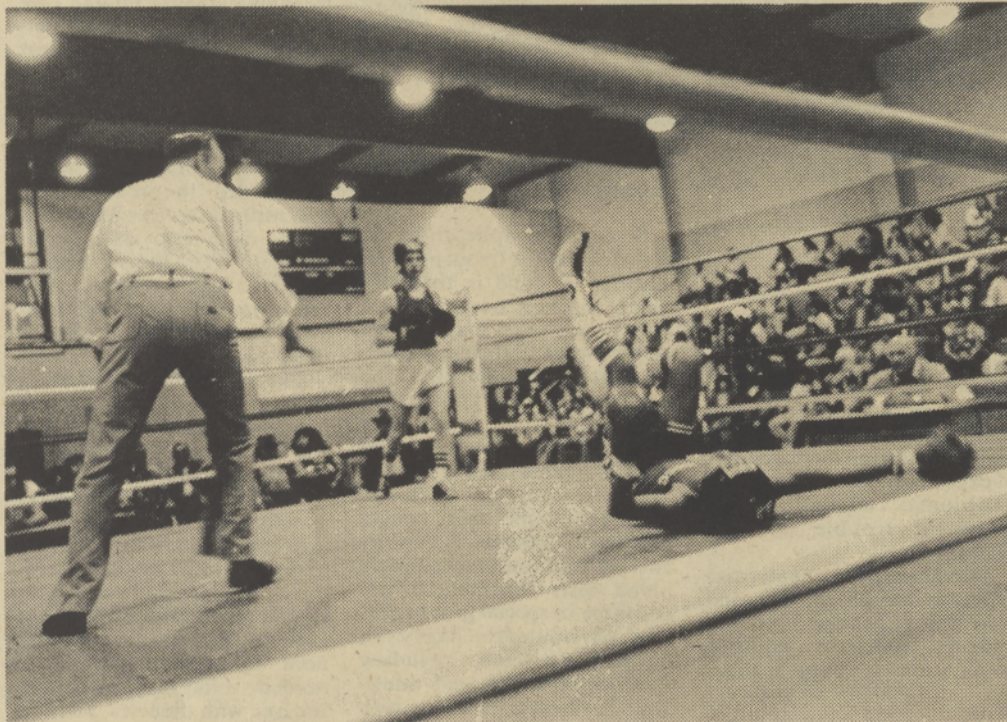

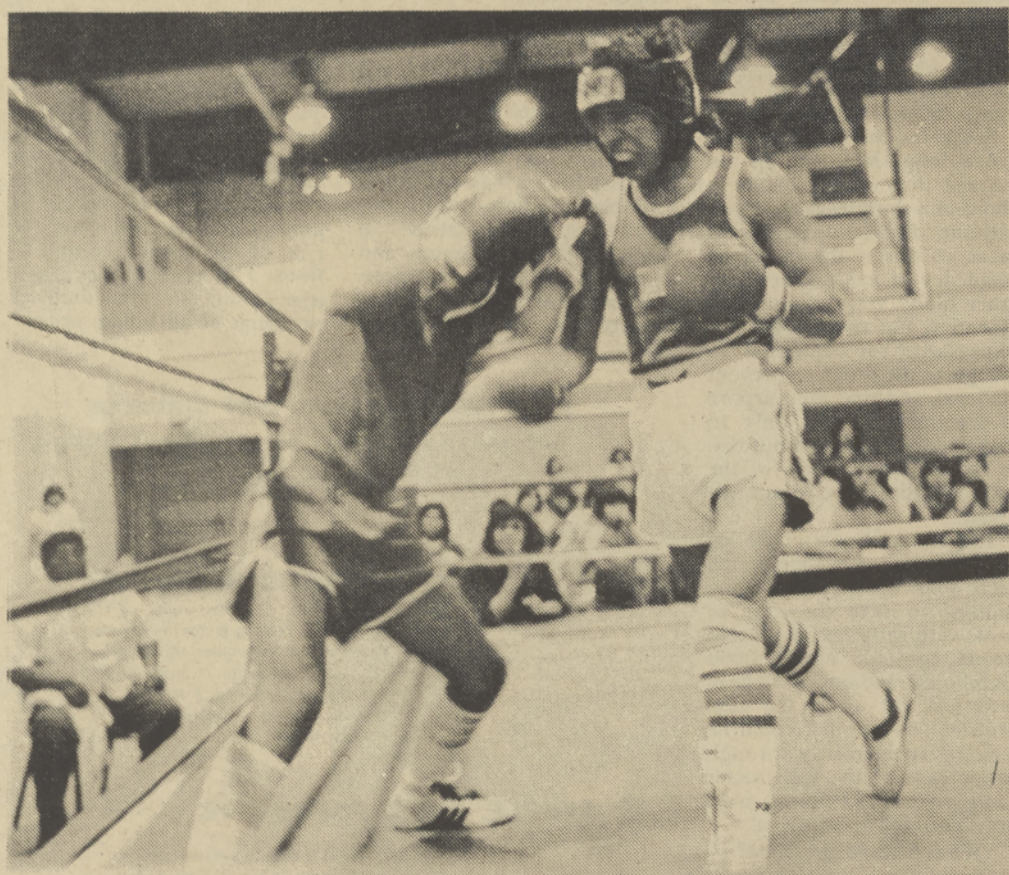

All-Indian rodeo May 17-18

The Tywama Saddle Club is sponsoring the Tygh Valley All-Indian Rodeo to be held May 17-18 at the Tygh Valley Indian rodeo grounds. Performances start both days at 1:30 p.m.

Admission to the rodeo will be; adults, \$4.00; children, \$2.00 and small kids free.

A buckaroo breakfast offered for \$4.00 and \$2.50 will be served Sunday from 6:30-10:30. Other meals are available on the grounds.

War dances will be held Saturday evening beginning at 6:30 p.m. The Western Dance will begin later on at 9:00 p.m.

Cowboys from throughout the Western States and Canada will be competing for the Top Hand Saddle. To qualify you must be entered in a timed

event and a judged event.

Events are; saddle bronc (purse \$400), barback bronc riding (purse \$350), bull riding (purse \$350 and limited to first 32 paid entries), and bull dogging, calf roping, barrel racing, wild cow milking, and team roping, each with a \$300 added purse. \$150 will be given to the first place winner of the wild horse race each day.

Entry fees will be \$25 and belt buckles will be awarded in each event.

Entries open May 1 and close May 12.

Bicycle Motocross every, Sunday

A recreational activity that can be enjoyed by children and shared with parents is bicycle motocross. Youngsters from 5 to 16 can compete for trophies and ribbons each Sunday afternoon at the Madras Fairgrounds.

About 30 boys and girls ride in the motocross each Sunday

at 2:00 p.m. The activity is new to Madras having started in the summer of 1979. There are competitive races across the nation for enthusiastic bicyclists.

There are some official requirements before participation can be approved. An application must be filled out

and insurance purchased for one year at \$7.00 through the American Bicycle Association. A track fee of \$3.00 is also required at each race.

Bicycles must have guards and no protruding bolts. Riders must wear helmets and nose guards. An official guide is available at the track.
