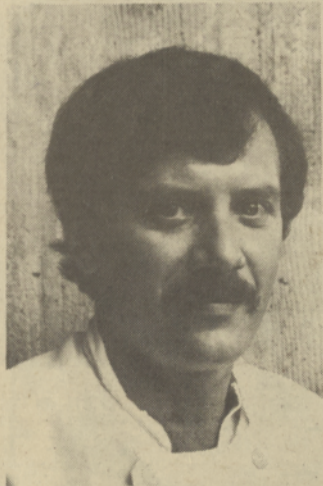


KNT hires new chef



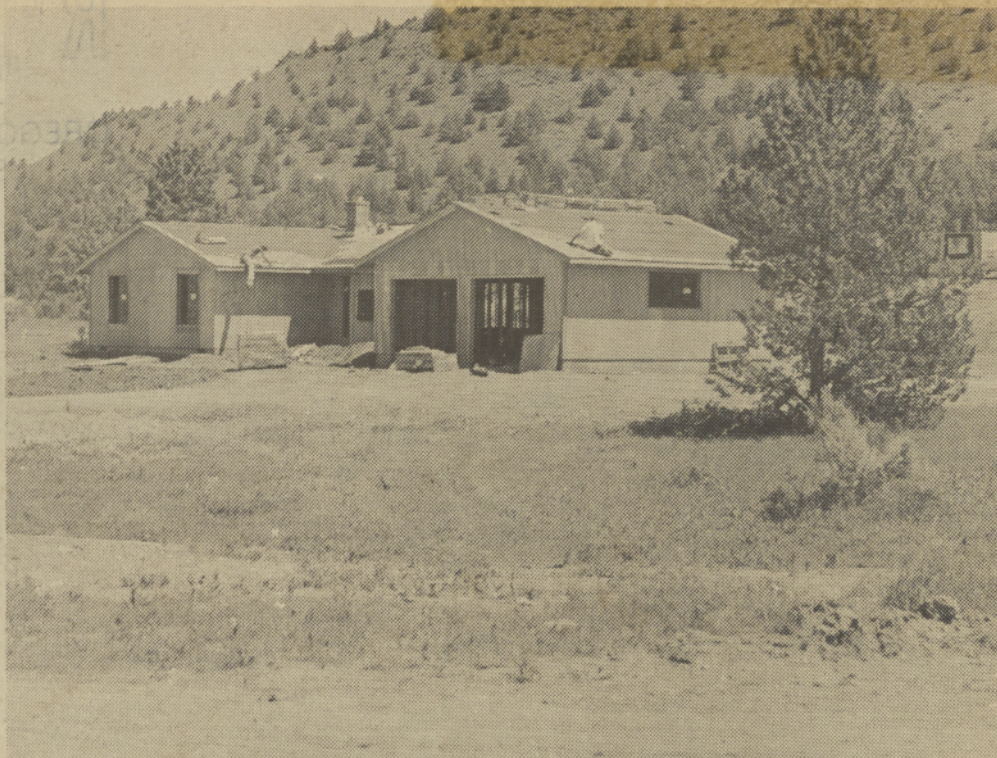
Daniel S. Miller

Alice's to take on new look



Most of us have driven by "Alice's" and noticed that it is completely gutted out. The ceiling beams are showing and plaster is hanging from the walls. The building will not look as we remember it for much longer.

The renovation, which will hopefully be completed within the next 45 to 60 days, was included in the 1980 operating budget. \$85,000 was budgeted for the remodeling, but that figure did not include any monies for exterior work. So, Tribal Council appropriated an additional \$40,000 for exterior work, with the feeling that the building needed a new look.

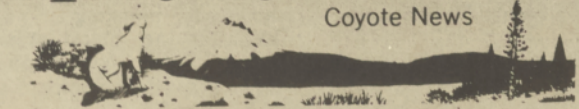
According to enterprise manager Ed Manion the entry door will be moved toward the middle of the building, away from the highway on the north side. The building will sport cedar siding and a mansard roof line (similar to the Rainbow Market's roof).

The interior will have enough seating for 78 guests with tables in the center. It is planned that there will be cafe-type service, with breakfast, lunch and dinner being served. Presently, there is no

manager for the restaurant, but Manion is not concerned about that. "There are lots of people around with experience enough to run it." Advertising will begin soon to seek out a manager.
