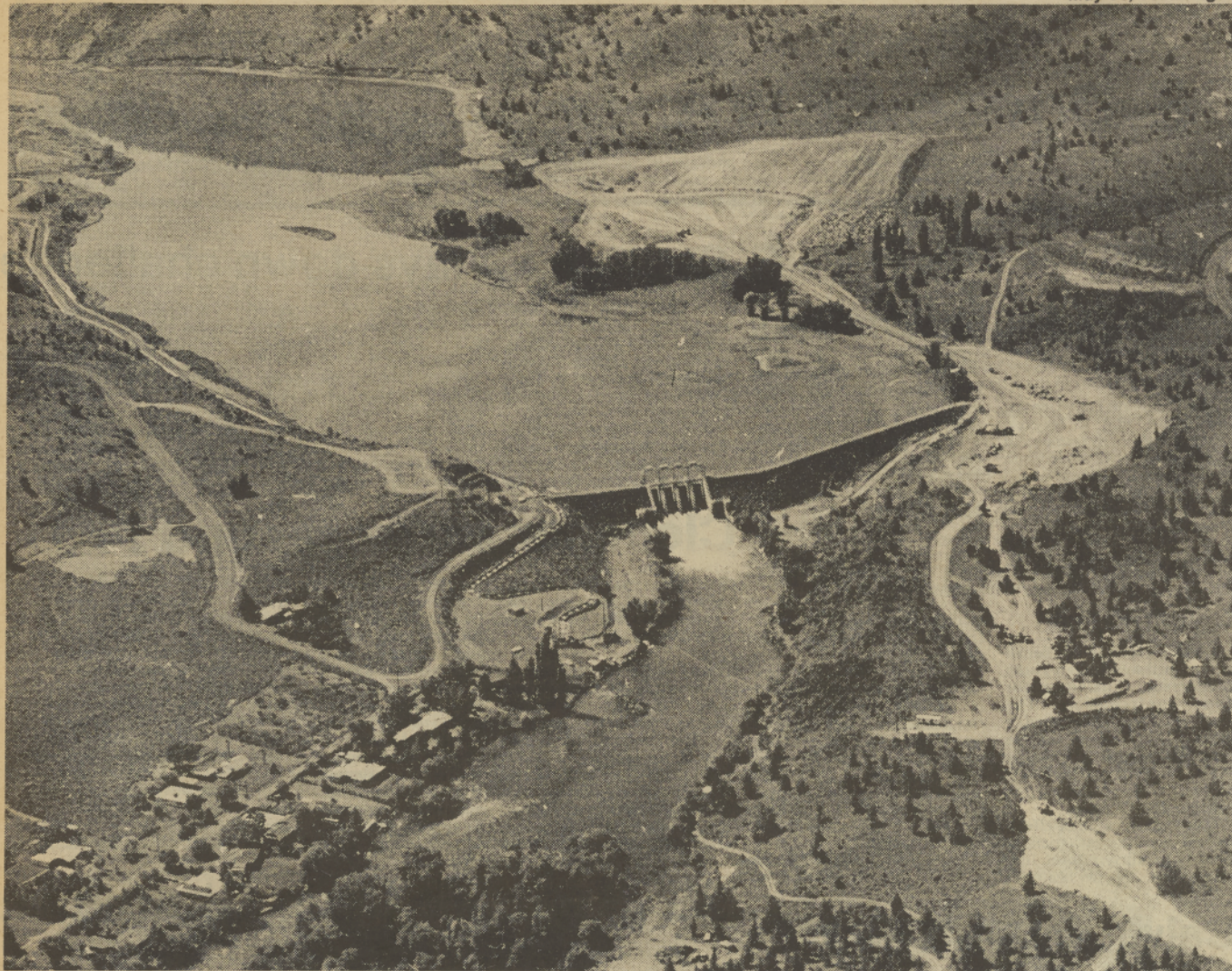




Hydro work begins, leaving scars



Changes sometimes go unnoticed, but the excavation work near the Pelton Reregulating Dam has left a scar that may take years to alter. Fred H. Slate Company began work about five weeks ago, moving car-sized boulders, soil and trees to prepare the dam for the turbine and powerhouse. With the project two days ahead of schedule, Slate's 23 employees have been working 60-hour weeks. Four 30-yard and two 20-yard rock hauling dump trucks and two large bulldozers as well as other equipment have been grinding and bumping long hours to get the work done.
