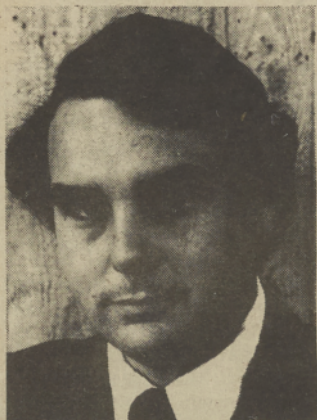


Bittner named to KNT post

Were you counted?

The 1980 Census is drawing to a close in this area and a final appeal is being made to make sure that everyone is counted. Individuals who feel that they or anyone else in their family have been missed should call the census office at 389-0170. People living outside the local dialing area can call collect.

David Rasmussen census district manager in Bend says the "Were you counted?" campaign is one of the final phases of the 1980 Census. "Callers who feel they have been missed will have their address checked against a master address list. In this way we can add anyone who is not on the list yet make sure no one is counted twice. It's simply another way of insuring that everyone is counted."

The district manager also said that the census office is now checking to make sure a

questionnaire for every household has been completed. Local residents hired as census takers have been in the field collecting questionnaires for several weeks. They have also had to contact households that returned incomplete forms.

As soon as all of the questionnaires have been gathered, the census office will total the population and housing counts and turn them over to the local officials for review. Only statistical totals will be turned over - individual census forms remain confidential. The purpose of the Local Review Program is to give local government officials a chance to spot errors in the counts while the census offices are open and census takers are able to check the problems. This effort is expected to contribute greatly to the accuracy and success of the 1980 Census.

Energy conservation tax incentives studied

The impact of federal tax incentives for alternate energy and conservation was explored in Congressional hearings in Oregon this month, Congressman Al Ullman reports.

Ullman, chairman of the Ways and Means Committee, conducted the hearing Saturday, June 7, in Bend and Monday, June 9, in Portland.

"We want to know the whether federal tax policies in conjunction with state tax incentives, are working," he said. "Oregon is an appropriate

place to begin our review because the state is a national leader in this effort."

"I am particularly pleased that State Rep. Tom Throop of Bend provided the benefit of his knowledge about the wide use of solar energy devices," Ullman said.

Ullman said state and local officials testified at the hearing, along with persons who have used the tax incentives.

The Bend hearing focused on renewable energy sources, with special emphasis on solar hearing. The Portland hearing concentrated on home weatherization credits.

In addition to the hearings, Ullman spent a day fishing on the Deschutes River, and held public meetings in Madras and Oregon City.

Chiefs open with three ties

The Warm Springs Chiefs, coached by Nelson Zomont, opened their minor league season with three ties. The fourth game ended in a tie but there was still time for more innings and Warm Springs suffered their first loss.

So far, the Chiefs have played Culver (12-12), Madras Plumbers (10-10), Madras Builders (8-8), and Thrifty Drug (13-12).

"League ruling states you can't play extra innings after 8:30," explained Zomont. After the regulation six innings, the first three games ended in ties at 8:30 p.m. and no more innings could be played.

"In all our games, the first three innings they (Chiefs) lay back. I don't know what's the problem, but the pitching has been keeping us in the game," Zomont said.

The Chiefs pitchers are Reynolds Allen and lefties Dion Minthorn and George Frank.

Explaining that his pitchers threw two innings apiece, Zomont said Dion had five strikeouts, George two, and Reynolds four.

The Chiefs heavy hitters are Cecil Govenor, who had two triples, two doubles, and a single, Michael Polk, who hit a homerun with two men on, and David LeClaire, who had a

homerun in the first game.

The young team had some trouble early in the season recruiting players. Zomont said he and Lyle Rhoan were picking up boys off the streets to play and were taking boys from the t-ball program. "Most haven't played baseball before, except for the pitchers," Zomont said. "Most played T-ball."

But where they lack in experience they're big in spirit. "They don't argue when they make errors on the field," the coach said, adding that the ties did discourage them some.

"They play hard, real hard. They work real well together," Zomont said.
