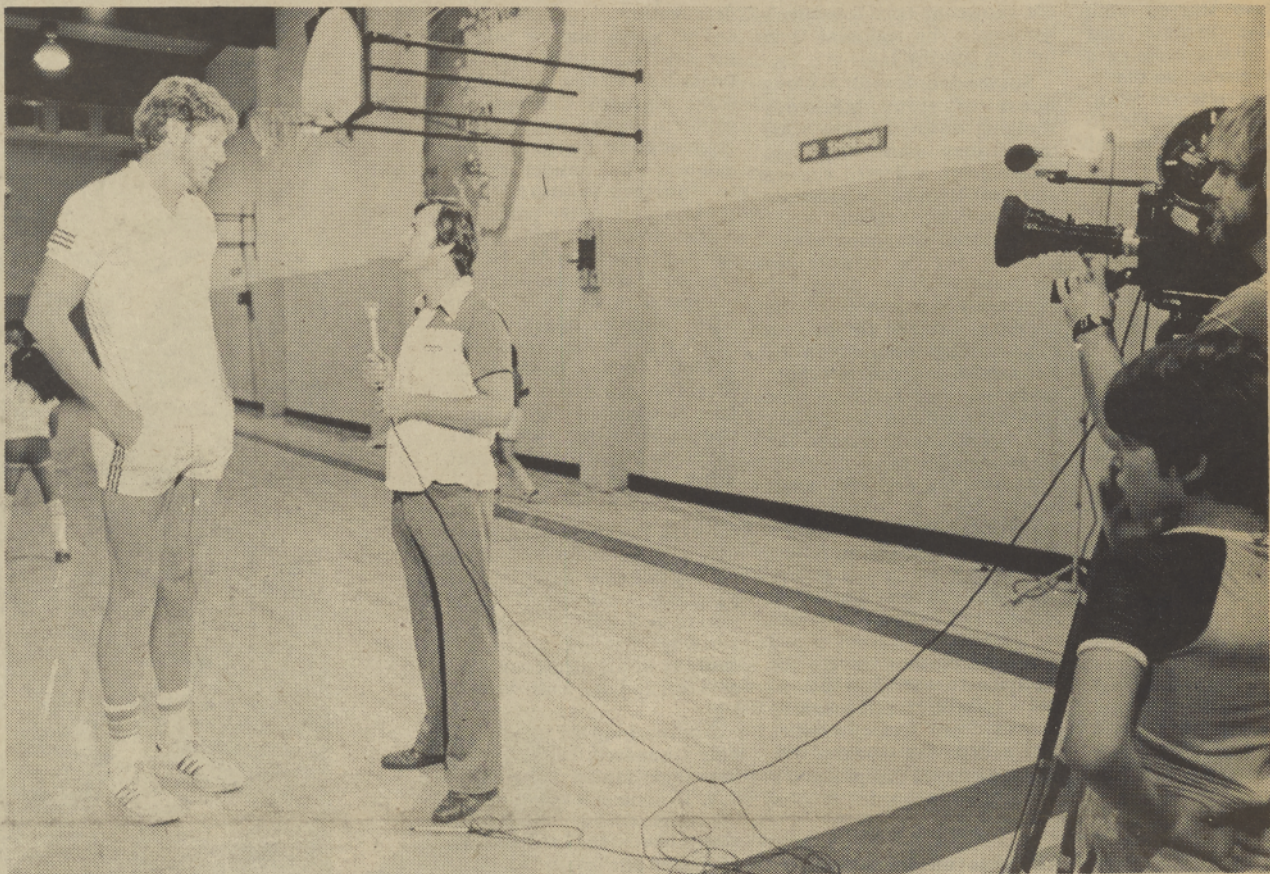
Walton conducts local basketball clinic for fifth year
