Fisheries management

throughout the basin, the tribal redraft proposes management techniques that include known-stock fisheries, fisheries that should not be confined to the upper river. The tribes have added lower river fisheries in the tributaries and a sanctuary at the mouth of the Columbia to the plan's priorities.

Tribal additions focus on serious act will be needed to achieve the original plan's

projections for vastly increased numbers of salmon returning to the river. Limited entry and fleet reduction in ocean fisheries are an example.

To restore the runs means managing salmon throughout their life cycle—from in-river spawning grounds to the ocean and back again," said George, "and that's what we want to do."
