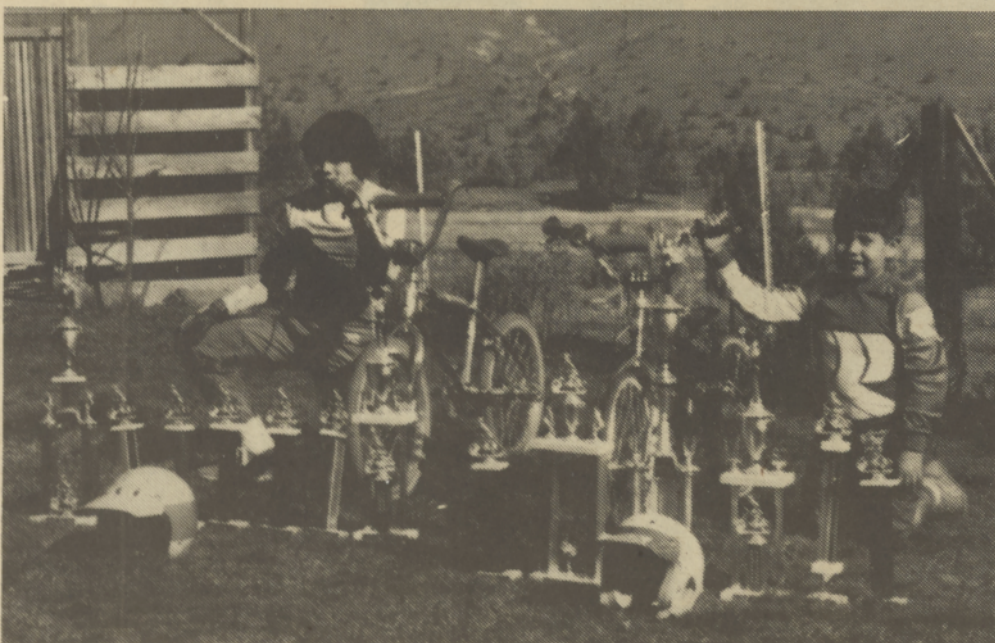
The purses for the various events are \$400 for saddle bronc, \$350 for bareback, \$350 for bull riding, \$300 for bull dogging, calf roping, wild cow milking, team roping and girl's barrel race. Wild horse racing is \$150 a day. Entry fee for all events is \$30. Team roping fee is \$60 per team and team fee for the wild horse race is \$30 and only the first eight entries will be accepted as entrants. Buckles will be awarded in all events.

Entries open April 30, 1981 and close at 8:00 p.m. May 11,

1981. Entries may be mailed to Rodeo Secretary, Ginger Johnson, P.O. Box 541, Warm Springs, Oregon 97761. An entry may be phoned in with a current WSIRA card at (503) 553-1461, 5:30 to 8:30 p.m. daily. A current negative Coggins test is required for stock brought to the rodeo grounds.

Other activities during the two day event include an Indian Arts and Crafts Fair. More information concerning this can be obtained by calling 544-2723. Saturday evening there will be Indian War dances at 6:30 and a western dance is scheduled for 9:00 p.m. The Buckaroo Breakfast will be held Sunday from 6:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. at a cost of \$4 and \$2.50.

Admission for adults is \$4, kids are \$2, small children are free. Camper parking fee is \$2 for the weekend and automobile parking is \$1 per day. Additional information may be obtained by phoning (503) 483-2347.
