

June BMX races

Three American Bicycle Association-sanctioned bicycle motocross races are scheduled to be held at the Warm Springs BMX track during the month of June. All ages, expert as well as novice, may enter.

The races are scheduled for the following days: Friday, June 12; Friday, June 19; and Saturday, June 27.

Registration for the Friday races is from 5:30 to 6:30 p.m. with the race beginning at 7:00 p.m. Registration for the Saturday race is from 9:30 to 10:30 a.m. on the day of the race with the race commencing at 11:00 a.m.

An entry fee of \$3 is charged for each contestant. First, second and third place trophies will be presented in every race.

All riders must present a current ABA membership card when registering for a race to receive points. Application for membership can be made prior to the race at the Community Center or on the day of the race where the entry fee is paid.

The ABA membership fee of \$17 includes insurance coverage. A non-member may register and participate but will receive no points and he must purchase insurance.
