July 12 race was double pointer

The bicycle motocross race held on July 12 at the Community Center was a double-pointer. Each American Bicycle Association member placing received double the points normally received in an ABA approved race.

The point system in BMX racing was initiated by the ABA which was formed to give national prominence to the sport. Under the rules of the sanction, a rider may accumulate points locally at his ABA sanctioned track and also on a national basis. A rider must be an ABA member to receive points although other rider can compete for trophies.

The number of points a rider has determines the class he is in. From novice, a rider would enter an expert class after competing in a number of races and accumulating enough points. He would thereafter compete with experts in his or her age group.

The district point distribution is as follows:

- Novice-1st—25 points; 2nd—20 points; 3rd—15 points; 4th—10 points; 5th—5 points.
- Expert-1st 50 points; 2nd—40 points; 3rd—30 points; 4th—20 points; 5th—10 points.
