Easy Applesauce

Here is an idea from Elsie Zehr on machine easy applesauce from small apples available in large quantities around Warm Springs.

1. Wash, quarter and remove worms from apples. Don't peel or core.
 2. Place apples in a roasting or shallow pan. Add water until it is 1/2 to "1" up the side of the

pan. Cover pan.
 3. Bake in oven or cook on top of stove until apples are soft. The water and heat steams the apples soft.
 4. Place apples in a corollander and push through. This removes seeds, stems and shins and makes the apples ready to eat or can as applesauce.
