Five all-stars were also selected including: Rod Cowapoo and Bill Quempts both of Pendleton; Rick Minthorn of Warm Springs; and two Yakima Nation player, one of those being Gary Pierce.

Local police, firefighters participate in Second Annual Olympics

The second Annual Police and Firefighter's Olympics were held in Salem August 6-9. Warm Springs participants were strong competitors in swimming, bowling, javelin, discus and shooting.

Five local men competed in the Olympics and brought home four gold medals (first place), two silvers (second place) and two bronze medals (third place). Ray Rivero, Fire and Safety Officer, represented Warm Springs in the mens open age, 18-32, and won three gold medals in swimming competition. Rivero set three new swimming records in the three events for state competition. He set a record for the butterfly with a time of 26.2, the 50 yard breast stroke with a time of 31.0 and in the 50 yard backstroke with a time of 27.9.

Nelson Zomont, a volunteer fireman, set a new record for the nation in the senior division for Police and Firefighters Olympics in the swimming

event of the 50 yard butterfly with a time of 28.0 thus cutting 3.3 seconds off the old record and winning a gold medal in that event. Nelson also won a bronze medal in the 50 yard free style in the senior division. The senior division was for those over 33 years of age.

The police department had three representatives who also brought home medals in their events, Ken Sibert won a silver medal and a bronze in bowling events, Rick Souers won a silver medal in the discus and a ribbon for fifth in the javelin. The results of Jim Macy in the shooting events at this time haven't been received.

The Warm Springs Police had more men entered in events but they had to cancel because the weekend competition coincided with the Huckleberry Feast. According to Chief of Police Jeffery Sanders, "It is work before play for the men in this department."

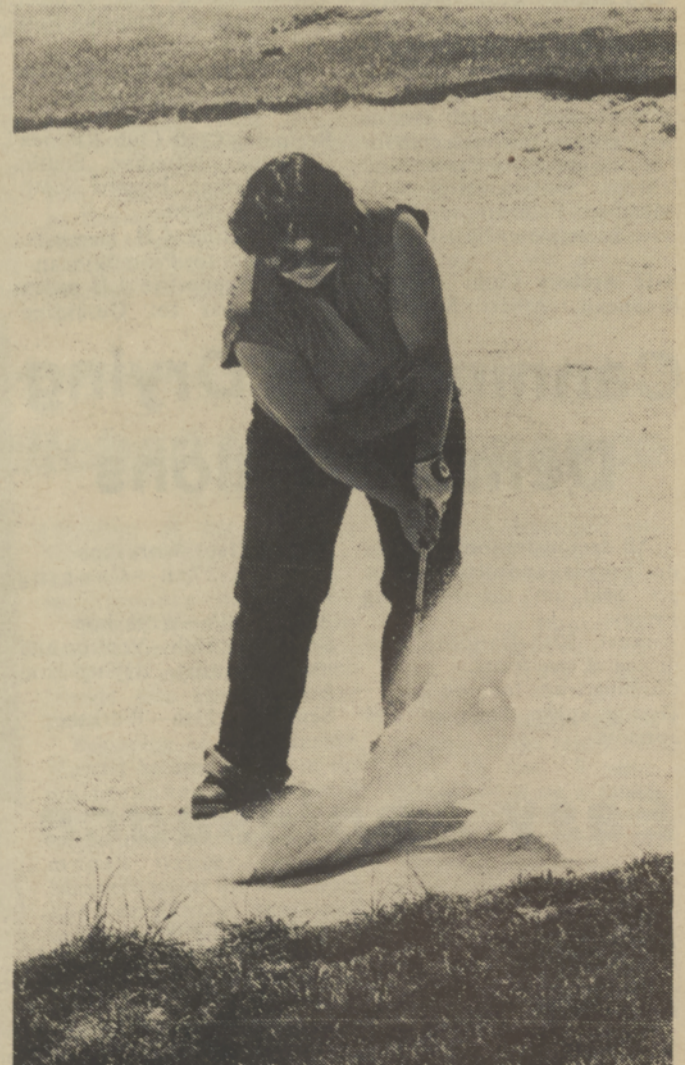
