Mutton Mountain fire under control

A 2,424 acre fire 15 miles northwest of Warm Springs on the Deschutes River, east of the Mutton Mountains, was continued Sunday evening after crews fought the fire throughout the weekend. The fire was reported at 5:50 p.m. Friday, August 28.

The 40-man crew, composed of forestry workers and fire management employees, fought the blaze during the day with 20 firefighters working to combat it throughout the nights. Two helicopters with 50-gallon buckets were used to drench the flames with water from the nearby river.



Kah-Nee-Ta has been making a hit with northwest news programs. The unique activities at the resort along with its location have made Kah-Nee-Ta a good subject. During the week of August 31 PM Magazine aired visits to the various activities offered by the resort including horseback riding, the village sauna, the salmon bake and rafting down the Deschutes River.
