## Nevada Day Celebration set

The 12th Annual Nevada Day Celebration will be held October 31 and November 1 at the Pyramid Lake Paiute Reservation. The celebration will be sponsored by the Pyramid Lake Indian Rodeo Association.

Events featured for the two days are an all-Indian rodeo, a western dance on Saturday, a beef bar-b-que on Sunday, handgames and gambling.

The events in the rodeo are saddle bronc, bareback, bull riding, calf roping, wild horse roping (1 go), wild cow milking, Sr. barrel racing, team roping (2 go), Jr. barrels (13 and under), Jr. calf riding (13 and under) and the wild horse race (3 per team). On Sunday there will be a top 8 saddle bronc ride-off with the winner taking a \$100 purse. A trophy saddle will go to the All-Around Cowboy.

The entry fees for rough riding events are \$25, fees for roping events are \$25 per man, Sr. barrels fees are \$20, Jr. events fees are \$5 and the wild horse team fee is \$35.

The rodeo is an amateur rodeo and is not a sanctioned rodeo. Contestants are required to be at least 1/4 Indian blood and will need tribal ID or proof of some kind.

The rodeo office will be open on October 26 and 27 from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. and the entries

will close October 27 at 9 p.m. Entries can be mailed in to the Pyramid Lake Rodeo Association, P.O. Box 255, Nixon, Nevada 89424. Entries must be postmarked no later than October 22.

Mailed fees will not be accepted unless they are accompanied with a money order. No checks will be accepted and wired money will not be accepted. For further information call 702 Nixon No. 3 or Nixon No. 29.
