Warren Wallulatum convicted

Warren Wallulatum, 20, has been found guilty of involuntary manslaughter by a federal court jury in connection with the August 16, 1980 death of Sally Rhoan. Wallulatum had been indicted and charged with involuntary manslaughter following a one-car accident in which Rhoan died from massive head injuries received in the accident.

Wallulatum was identified as the driver of the car which left the road and struck a tree. Two other persons were in the car at the time and they received

injuries. Wallulatum was also injured in the accident.

Evidence was presented by the U.S. Attorney's office by medical experts which showed Wallulatum had been drinking shortly before the accident and at the time of the accident he had a blood alcohol level of .21. A level of .10 or more is considered evidence that a person is legally intoxicated.

U.S. District Judge James Burns ordered a presentence investigation prior to sentencing scheduled for Jan. 4.

Thompson pleads guilty

Curtis Lee Thompson, 19, pleaded guilty to criminally negligent homicide Monday in Madras Circuit Court in connection with the July 26 death of Larry Stephen Blasingame.

Blasingame died of injuries when the vehicle driven by Thompson crashed into a mobile home where Blasingame was sleeping at the

Deschutes Trailer Court.

Oregon State Police reported that the auto spun out of control at the shoulder of the road, went over the embankment backwards and sailed down into the trailer court where it rammed the mobile home.

There were three other occupants in the car, all from Warm Springs.

Smith found guilty

U.S. District Judge J. Redden found Victor Smith, Sr. guilty of involuntary manslaughter in the June 19, 1981 death of his wife Margie

Danzuka Smith.

Judge Redden ordered a presentence investigation and set the sentencing date for January 8, 1982.

Hit and run victim

The BIA is investigating an apparent hit and run in West Hills in which Bob Speakthunder was the victim. He was found on Shepard Lane during the early morning hours of December 5.

Speakthunder was trans-

ported to St. Charles Medical Center where his injuries were identified as broken ribs, a dislocated hip, bone chips of the spine and a laceration on his leg. His condition is listed as stable.

Brucellosis

bouts of fever and malaise (not feeling well) are the symptoms. The disease usually develops like the flu and persists for several weeks or more.

The initial symptoms of undulant fever are tiring easily, headaches, followed by high fever, chills, drenching sweats, joint pain, backache, loss of weight and appetite. The disease does not frequently cause death but is not to be dealt with lightly.

With the eradication program in the United States and the pasteurization of milk the causes of brucellosis have diminished greatly, but unfortunately the disease still exists as evidenced by cattle at the Hay Creek Ranch.

To avoid contracting brucellosis it is recommended that ranchers and farmers take the precaution of cleaning areas likely to become infected and keeping them clean. They should wear gloves when assisting cows during calving. Drinking pasteurized milk rather than raw milk is also recommended.

Vaccination of calves for brucellosis is the best way to eradicate the disease. A veterinarian can administer the vaccine. By doing this ranchers can avoid the misfortune experienced at Hay Creek Ranch.

Once a herd is found to have brucellosis all attempts are made to trace the disease.
