The Oregon Women In Leisure Service has recently elected officers to serve one-year terms. Assistant Community Center Director Eva Montee was chosen to serve as secretary for the O.W.L.S.

O.W.L.S. is a subsidiary of the Oregon Parks and Recreation Society. It is a new organization according to Montee and is intended to be a

means of education for those in that field.

The goals of the O.W.L.S. are: 1. To be of the greatest service to the general membership of Oregon Parks and Recreation Society; 2. To further the credibility of the leisure profession field; 3.
