## Endurance Race

The date for the Jackpot Endurance Race has been set for April 10. The race is sponsored by the Tribal Council Steno Pool. Entries will close at 8:00 a.m. on April 10.

The race is an annual event held during the spring, usually on Root Feast weekend. The race course has been the same for the last two years but this year a new course has been mapped out. The race is open to people in three classes: 1. men 18 years and older with an entry fee of \$50. 2. women 18 years and older with an entry

fee of \$30 and 3. juniors 10-17 years of age with an entry fee of \$25.

There will be a trophy for the winner of each division. The winner of the men's race will receive the "Elmer Quinn Challenge Trophy." Emerson "Chief" Smith has been the winner of the trophy for the last two years. If he wins again the trophy will be his to keep.

Riders in each event are required to use a stock saddle. They also need to sign a waiver in case of injury. People interested may contact Wilma Scott at the Tribal Council Office (503) 553-1161, ext. 258.

## Here's your chance to run around a bit

### Xinita Benefit Run April 17

For those who aren't quite up to running a marathon or mini-marathon race, there is the Xnita Benefit Run coming up Saturday, April 17, at Kah-Nee-Ta.

There are two courses—one a 6.2 mile run and the other a 3 mile run for fun. Both runs end at Kah-Nee-Ta Village, the same as in the Simnasho Mini-Marathon. The race surface is on blacktop.

Until April 9, the entry fee is \$5. The fees will rise to \$7 after April 9 and on the day of the races. Runners must pick up

their packets before 11:45 a.m. April 17. Registration closes at 11:30 a.m. **No exceptions.**

All runners will be transported to starting points, with the last bus leaving at 12 noon. The races begin at 1 p.m.

Runners in the 6.2 mile race will be given identification numbers, and the divisional winners of the 6.2 mile run will receive a special award. All racers will receive a T-shirt.

While the 3 mile run is strictly a "run for fun," there are five divisions in the men's and women's 6.2 mile run—13

& under, 14-18, 19-29 and 40 & over.

Pre-registration forms are available at the Administrative Service Center (Steno Pool), and at the Spilyay Tymoo office on the 2nd floor of the old admin. building.

The race is to benefit the steno pool secretaries for a training retreat.

### Satus Run April 24

The Satus Longhouse will hold its second annual 12 kilometer run (7.2 miles) on Saturday, April 24. The race will start and finish near the Satus Longhouse, Satus, Washington. The starting time is scheduled for 1:00 p.m.

The awards will include jackets for the first male and

female finisher. Winners in each division will receive a first place plaque and the second and third place winner will each receive a medal in their respective event.

Any of the runners who are entered in the tribal dance contests are excused from the run and credit for points will be

awarded for the grand entry performance during the time of the race.

### Pendleton Run May 1

A fun run is scheduled for May 1, 1982, concluding two weeks of root feast activities. The run is sponsored by the Yellowhawk Employees Association.

Courses offered include 1 mile of babybuggy pushing, 2.5 miles of flat pavement and 9.3 miles of severely hilly, paved and graveled terrain. First aid stations will be provided.

The run will begin at the Yellowhawk clinic, with check-

in time set for 8 a.m. An active presentation on fitness by Fran Moses and Julie Mitchell will precede and conclude the event.

A \$5.00 entry fee before April 23 will guarantee runners a T-shirt and entrants will be eligible for prize drawings at the conclusion of the race.

### Three Sisters Classic April 18

If you weren't ready for the Simnasho Mini-Marathon, or didn't do as well as you'd hoped, there's plenty of time to prepare for the upcoming Three Sisters Classic.

The fourth annual run is scheduled for Sunday, April 18, in Bend and the course is on private land. There will be two separate races—a one-half marathon of 13.1 miles and a 6.2 mile course.

Starting time is a 11 a.m. and both runs begin and finish at Central Oregon Community College. Dressing facilities and showers are available for participants.

The entry fee is \$7.50, with all proceeds going to support community youth projects. The Bend Optimist Club is sponsoring the event.

Courses are hilly and mostly paved. They offer runners a scenic view of the Oregon Cascades. Runners should be advised that both courses may present a stiff challenge to those who are not used to hill running at an elevation of 4,000 feet above sea level.

Runners should be further advised that the weather in Bend in April is highly unpredictable. The temperature may range from below freezing to in the 80s, so come prepared. In addition, there will be drawings for prizes at the awards ceremony after the race.
