Administrative Assistant Management \$33,686/year

Will be responsible for aiding the Secretary/Treasurer and subordinate department officials in accomplishing the duties required when dealing with organizational methods, funds, personnel, equipment and other tools or resources of management. Duties involve working in several vital functions and services such as management analysis, procurement, contract administration, space management, security administration, reports management, data processing and other closely related activities. Responsibilities include performing certain duties acting in the capacity of the Secretary/Treasurer during his absence. A college degree in business Administration and a minimum of five (5) to eight (8) years prior experience in civic and business management, five (5) of which must have been in a supervisory capacity. A combination of education and experience may be substituted. Must have a valid Oregon Driver's license. Incumbent should have similar personal qualities of the Secretary/Treasurer. Administrative Services Administrator Administrative Services \$33,686-\$43,000/year (salary depends upon qualifications and experience)

Will have the responsibility and authority for providing direct administrative support services to the Tribal organization as well as information to the local community in general. To carry out the administrative service functions, the Administrator is responsible for the following departments: Personnel, CETA Program, Printing Services, Records, Spilay Tymoo and Steno Services. A college degree in Business Administration, Accounting or a related field; plus a minimum of nine (9) to thirteen (13) years of working experience in the Administrative services field, five (5) to seven (7) of which must be proven general management, administrative, or supervision of a service or support

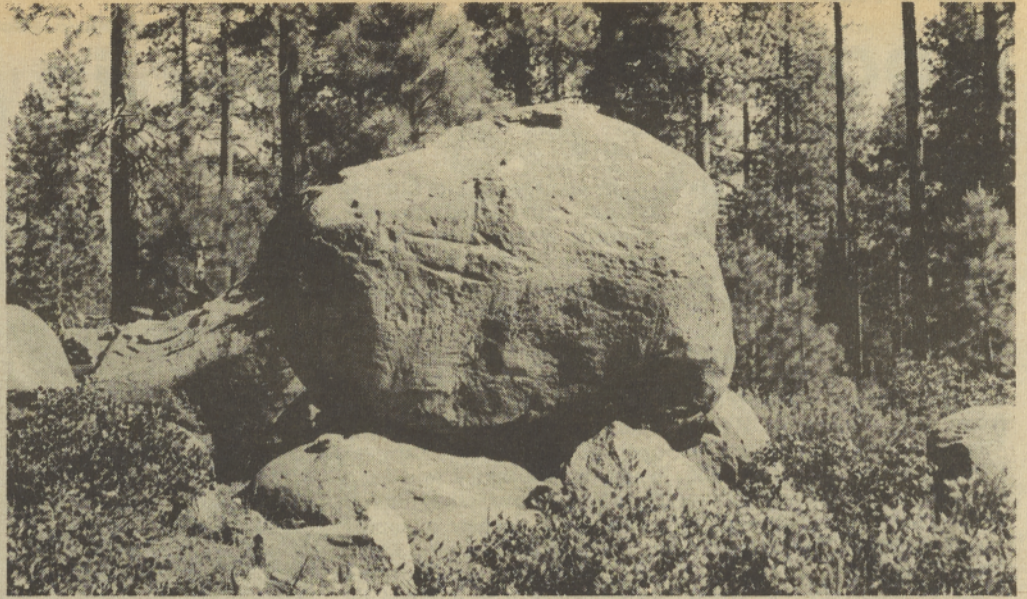
program, or a combination of education and experience may be substituted; and a valid Oregon Driver's License. Tribal member preference will be given—**Closes and must be postmarked by 8/20/82. A Tribal application form and a resume must be submitted.**

Education Administrator Education Services \$33,686-\$43,000/year (salary depends upon qualifications and experience)

Will have the responsibility and authority for the identification of educational needs, administration of supplemental Tribal education agency services and development of cultural resources on the Warm Springs Reservation. To carry out the education functions, the Administrator is responsible for the following departments: Education Coordinator, Training (Pre-employment), Early Childhood, Home Extension Service, Cultural/Heritage. A college degree in Education or a related field; plus a minimum of nine (9) to thirteen (13) years of working experience in the Education field, five (5) to seven (7) of which must be proven general management, administrative or supervision of a comprehensive education program; or a combination of a comprehensive education program; or a combination of education and experience may be substituted and a valid Oregon Driver's license. Tribal member preference will be given—**Closes and must be postmarked by 8/20/82. A Tribal application form and a resume must be submitted**

Enterprise Services Administrator Enterprise Services \$33,686-\$43,000/year (Salary depends upon qualifications and experience)

Will have the responsibility and authority for the development and management of Tribal enterprises which provide financial return, services at cost, and employment as well as support for the development of private Tribal member enterprise. To carry out the Enterprise Service function, the Administrator is responsible for the following departments: Credit, Gift Shop/Vending, Garage, Vehicle Pool.

Public Works Administrator Public Works Service \$33,686-\$43,000/year (salary depends upon qualifications and experience)

Will have the responsibility and

authority for the management of those public services provided and designated by the Confederated Tribes for the maintenance, improvement and protection of the community environment. To carry out the Public Works function, the Administrator is responsible for the following departments: Utilities, Parks/ Recreation, Assembly Plant, Housing, Engineer and Fire and Safety. A college degree in basic Engineering or a related field; plus a minimum of five (5) to thirteen (13) years of working experience in the public works field, five (5) to seven (7) of which must be proven general management, administrative or supervision of a comprehensive public works program; or a combination of education and experience may be substituted and a valid Oregon Driver's license. Tribal member preference will be given—**Closes and must be postmarked by 8/20/82. A tribal application form and a resume must be submitted.**

Fire destroys portable debarker

"That wasn't the place to be" was the response made by Chris Keesecker who was operating a portable debarker at Warm Springs Forest Products Industries after jumping from the machine when it went up in flames. Keesecker escaped without injury but the debarker is a total loss.

Keesecker explained that he was operating the debarker on July 26 when "It just started on fire. The fire was in the cab

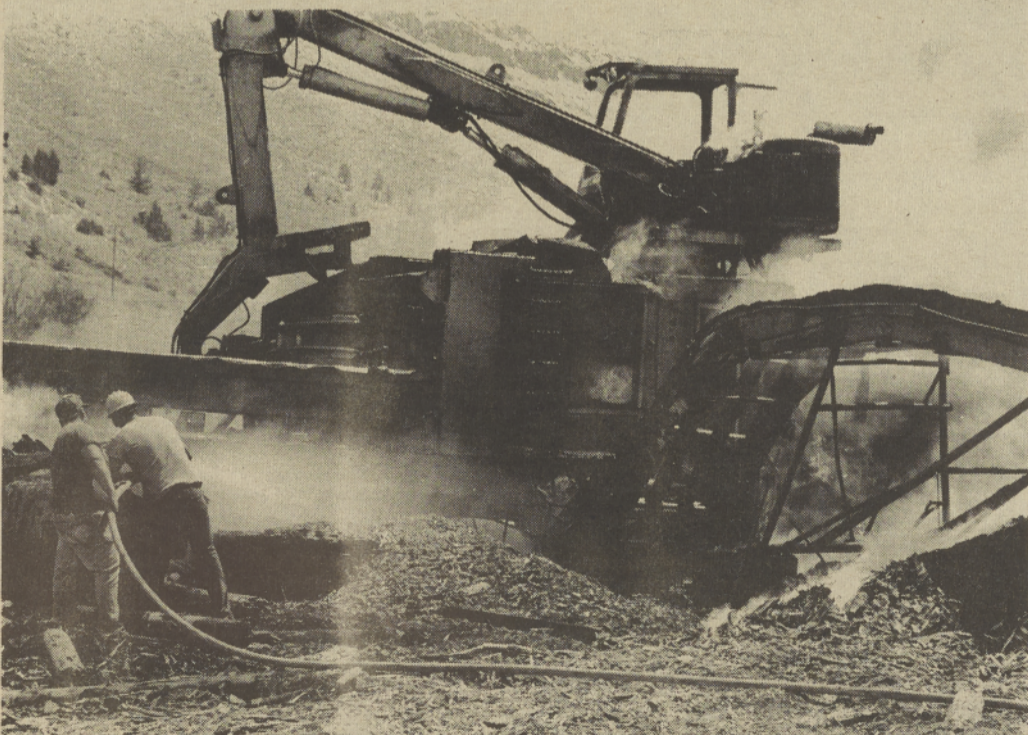
by the time I was out of it."

The debarker unit along with a chipper is contracted from Echo Lumber Company in Sweet Home, Oregon.

The fire was reported to Warm Springs Fire and Safety department at 1:38 p.m. It was extinguished by 2:14 according to fire fighter Fred Muniz. The fire was confined to the machine. Firefighters remained at the scene of the fire to cool the machine down.

A broken hydraulic line was determined to cause the fire. Muniz stated, "This has happened before on debarkers." Witnesses at the fire explained the way it happens. The hydraulic hose breaks releasing oil onto the exhaust pipe where heat from the exhaust ignites the oil.

The Sweet Home company has sent another debarker to replace the one destroyed by fire.

Raymond Meanus, 38, died on July 31 at the Yakima Valley Memorial Hospital from injuries received in a car accident. He was born on June 10, 1944 to Clarence Meanus and Myrtle Queaphama Scott in Redmond, Oregon.

He was a member of the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs, a member of the Simnasho Longhouse, and a basketball coach for the Medicine Valley Speelys. He was employed by the White Swan Lumber Company. He was known throughout the Northwest as a fancy dancer at many powwows. He had been a runner at many of the fun runs held in the Yakima Valley area.

On January 1, 1969 he married Blanche Culps at Madras, Oregon. He attended schools in the Warm Springs and Madras area.

Surviving him is his wife Blanche and a son, Scott Neal of White Swan; four brothers Olsen Meanus, Leroy Scott and Zane Scott of Warm Springs and Marvin Meanus of Phoenix, Arizona; and five sisters Hilda Culpus, Beatrice Winishut, Josepha Crowe and Jeanette Yazzie all of Warm Springs and Nancy Yallup of White Swan, Washington. Also surviving are numerous nieces and nephews.

Dressing services were held at the Merrit Funeral Home in Wapato, Washington conducted by members of the Seven Drum Religion on August 2 at 10 a.m. Overnight services were held at his home in White Swan on August 2. Tribal overnight services were held at the Simnasho Longhouse on August 3. Burial was at the Simnasho Cemetery at 8 a.m.
