Winter term application deadline for Tribal Scholarships is Friday, December 10. Students should have completed their Financial Aid Packets and admission papers to the College.

All new students will be

required to come in for a personal interview. Please contact the Education department at ext. 262/403 to schedule an appointment.

Students currently enrolled Fall term/semester, applications should be submitted

unless you have applied for the 82-83 school year. A copy of your fall term grade report is required to determine your funding eligibility.

All applications received after December 10th, will be processed for Spring Term.

Christmas tree cutting approved

The Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs Indian Reservation, in keeping with the spirit of Christmas, have consented to the cutting of Christmas trees by Warm Springs agency, Kah-Nee-Ta, PHS, Warm Springs school employees and Warm Springs churches!

Cutting is limited to one tree per family and on tribal lands only. It is suggested that trees be cut in the area of the Trout Lake Road near the power line crossing.

Trees should be cut away from the main road and close to the ground. All live branches should be removed from the

stump. Topping of trees larger than 12 feet in height is not permitted. Trees should not be cut that do not have another tree growing within 12 feet of the tree to be cut.

Information on tribal land location and road conditions may be obtained from the branch of Forestry.

Summary of 1983 Revenue Sharing Budget Available

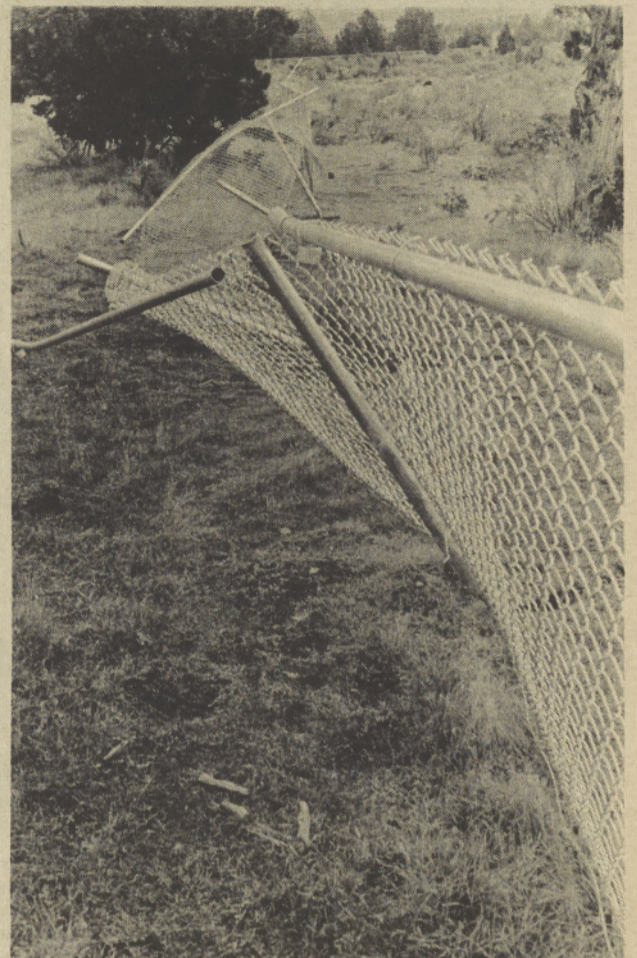
