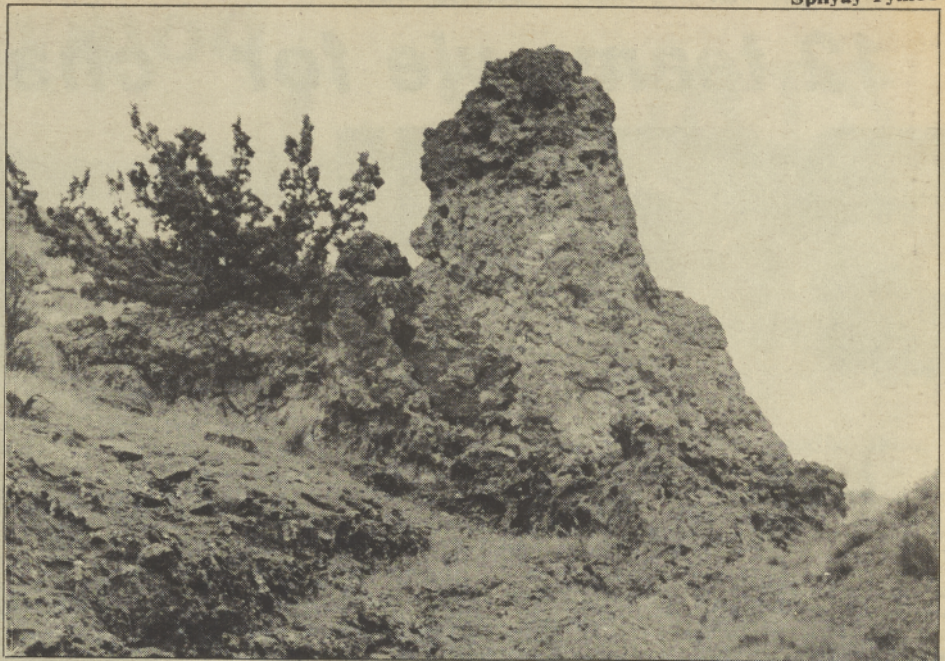
Toastmasters meeting

Enrollment for Bacone begins Jan. 12

Enrollment for all new and returning students at Bacone College in Muskogee, Oklahoma, is now in progress, according to the Office of the Registrar.

Spring semester classes will begin on January 12, and the last day of enrollment will be January 25.

Class offerings include art, silversmithing, bronze casting, humanities and religion, music, health and physical education,

language arts, journalism, mathematics and science, computer science, nursing, radiologic technology, business and business mid-management, secretary science, home economics and social science.

In addition to regular daytime classes, 12 evening classes will be available, each class meeting one night a week.

Bacone College was founded in 1880 in Indian Territory. It is the oldest continuing college in

the state of Oklahoma, and the oldest college in the United States specializing in education for American Indian students. Bacone is two-year liberal arts college which awards the associate of arts degree.

Seeking positive image

An American Indian/Alaskan Native artist living Oregon, who can best create a positive image of the American Indian family through his or her artistic work, will be granted a \$300.00 cash award by the Oregon Commission on Indian Services.

The work of the prize-winning artist (must be a resident of Oregon) will be featured on a public information poster distributed state-wide to public services agencies, Children's Services Division offices, tribal offices, and American Indian program offices. The poster will communicate the basic provisions of the Indian Child Welfare Act passed by Congress in 1978.

The intent of the Act is to prevent the break-up of American Indian families and to provide American Indian tribes with the exclusive right to determine the future of their children.

Prior to passage of the Act, an alarmingly high percentage of Indian families was broken up by the often unwarranted removal of their children and placed in non-Indian foster or adoptive homes which did not reflect the unique values of American Indian culture essential to the development of Indian children.

The competition is being sponsored with the cooperation of the Children's Services Division and the Oregon Legal Services Native American Program. The cash award is being made possible by a grant from the Oregon Arts Commission and the National Endowment for the Arts.

To receive the specifications on how art work should be submitted, artists of American Indian/Alaska Native ancestry, and who are residents of Oregon, are encouraged to write the Commission on Indian Services at 454 State Capitol, Salem, Oregon 97310; or call (503) 378-5481. The deadline for receiving entries is February 1, 1983.
