

# New semester starts 1982 had many rewards

## Grant applications due

The month of January is very important to all seniors who would like to attend the institution of their choice.

In order to assist a student in meeting college costs the U.S. Government gives money in a grant called the "Pell Grant." All students wanting to receive this Pell Grant or other grants must fill out a financial aid form (FAF) during the month of January. The FAFs may be picked up at the high school counseling office. The form is complex and difficult to fill out. A workshop to assist parents in filling out this form will be held January 10, 1983 at 7:30 p.m. in the high school library.

Bureau of Indian Affairs scholarships and grants are given for academic achievement, leadership, and most of all, financial need. It is very important that a student fill out

the FAF and send it in for processing during the month of January. Many college's have campus based funds which are distributed to eligible students by March 1, 1983. Freshman students need to receive these funds along with the other students. College is expensive and when students follow the necessary deadlines they stand a good chance of receiving some kind of financial aid.

I would like to remind everyone the FAFs must be filled out completely and thoroughly. If they have any blank spaces, or information missing, the college scholarship service will send them back to you and you must reprocess the FAF which will cause unnecessary delay.

Remember the financial aid workshop will be held January 10, 1983 at the Madras High School Library 7:30 p.m.

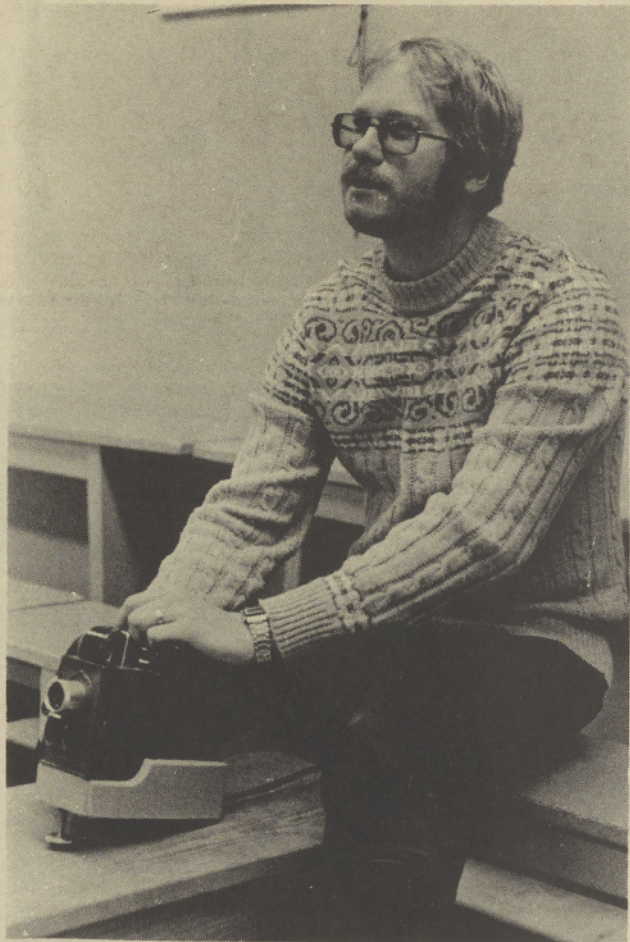
This is a good time for us, at Warm Springs Elementary, to reflect on the happenings and events of 1982.
