Pendleton emerges champ

Buck Jones of the Pendleton Bucks was named the most valuable player for the 24th annual Warm Springs Holiday Basketball tournament held December 29, 30, 31 and January 1. Jones also claimed the high scorer honors averaging 34 points per game. Seymour Reuben of the Pendleton Bucks earned the Mr. Hustle trophy.

The Pendleton Bucks emerged with the championship trophy and jackets. In their first game they defeated Sprague River from the Klamath area by a score of 119-106. In their second game they just got by the Taholah, Washington team with a one point lead (84-83). They met and defeated the Yakima Players in their third game to reach the championship game. In a fast and close championship playoff they held the Simnasho Travelers to gain the championship trophy and title.

The final standing for the tournament was Pendleton Bucks with first; the Simnasho Travelers in second; Phoenix "21st Century Native Americans" of Arizona in third and The Yakima Players took the fourth place trophy. All four teams have earned a berth in the 25th Silver Anniversary W.S. Holiday tournament to be held in December, 1983.

The Warm Springs Magpies were awarded the Sportsman trophy.

the Pendleton Bucks; Mike Jordan and John Ramariz of the Simnasho Travelers; Terry Randall of Santa Clara, California; Jim Wabunsee and

The teams invited to participate in this year's Holiday tournament were the Simnasho Travelers; Colville, Washington; Taholah, Washington; the Yakima Nation; Yakima Players; Warm Springs Magpies; Pendleton Bucks; Sprague River; Lapwai Idaho, Santa Clara, California; Phoenix, Arizona and Ft. Peck, Montana. The Ft. Peck team didn't show so the Warm Springs Duffers filled their berth.

According to Satch Miller, tournament director, the 25th Silver Anniversary Holiday Tournament to be held in December of 1983 which has been in the planning stages is going to be celebrated with the offering of bigger and better awards for both players and teams, the return of past queens, the return of the original host team players and the original Holiday tournament committee will be present. The plans for the anniversary have already been set in motion. "So plan to attend our tournament for 1983," Satch, encouraged.
