Men's bowling league

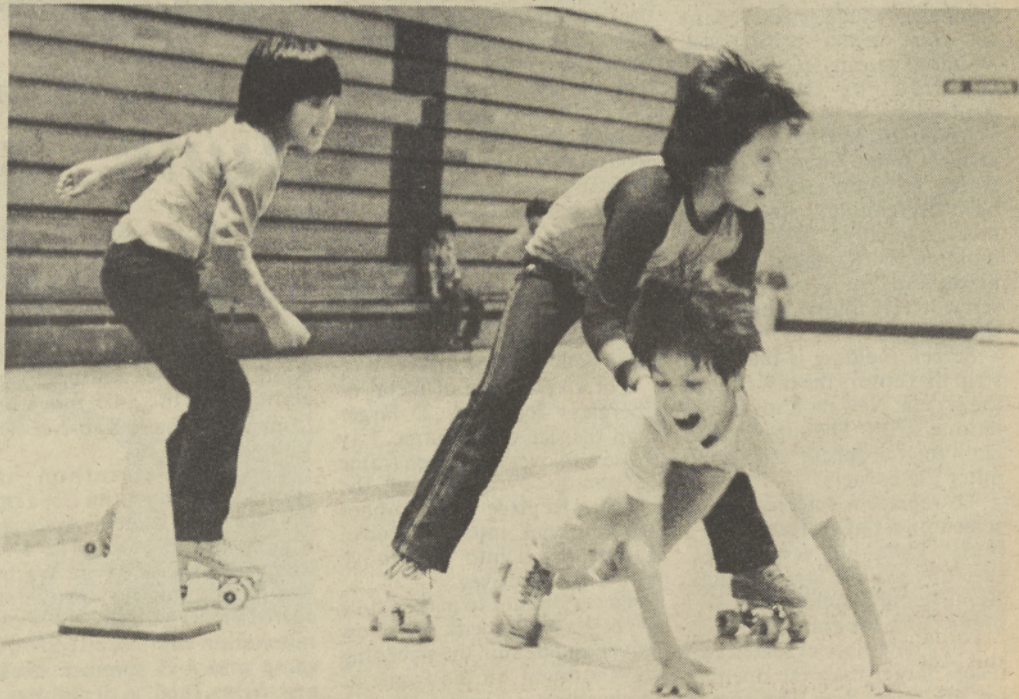
