

Girl's Varsity—"No chance for state"

There's no chance for state," explains MHS girl's varsity basketball coach Bonnie Souers. A recent loss to Vale in league play has made that pretty certain.

"We haven't been to consistent," says Souers. "We'll play a totally different ball each game."

The reason for this Souers concluded is the inexperience of the team. Most of the girls are sophomores. The competition has been equal, she says, "but this is a young squad."

The Buffaloes defeated Nyssa in a home game played January 29. "Lana Shike and Anita Bryant did some super playing," Souers said. They were able to get good offensive rebounding position and got a number of shots to keep Nyssa's Scarborough to 13 points. The game ended in a close 37-36.

An additional accomplishment for the girls, she adds, is their increasing ability to look to the basket first rather than passing the ball.

"They played real well" against Burns last Friday night, Souers says, defeating the Hilanders 47-40. The Madras girls displayed "the best rebounding of the whole season." All five players scored.

The Vale game did not end so well. "We made 8 points in the second half. We couldn't make a shot for anything. They beat

us by almost 10 points." The final score for that game was Vale-42, Madras-31.

There's a possibility the team could make it to state in third place, related Souers. In discussing the prospect with the girls the team has decided instead to concentrate on letting everyone play. "We just want everyone to get good playing time and leave the season feeling good."

Vale and McMinnville are currently tied for first in league play.

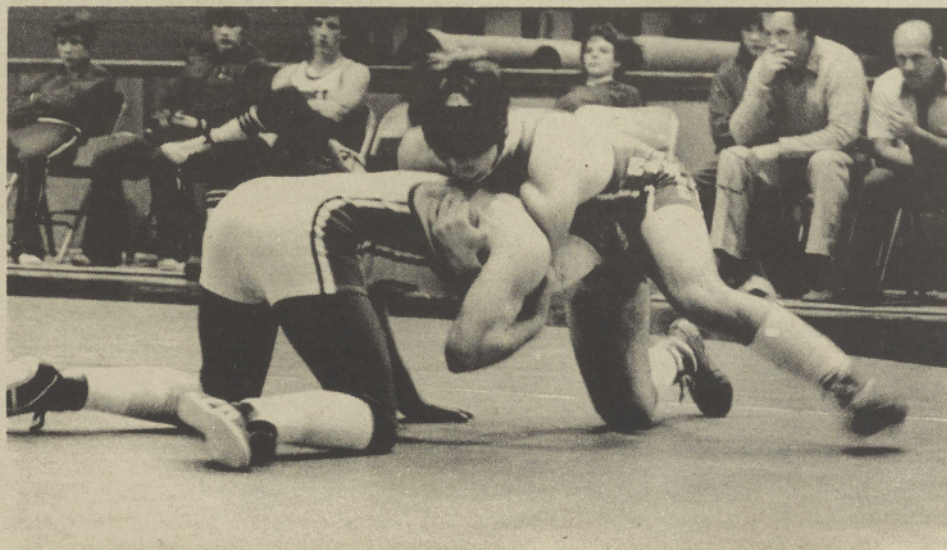
