## Nominees must be present

Nominations for Tribal Council are in the process of being scheduled. In line with this, the Agency District has instituted a new rule. If a person is nominated, that person must be present to accept or decline—or if that person cannot attend the meeting, then written confirmation must be presented at time of the nomination. If this is not done, that nomination will not be recognized.

For your information, qualifications for office as stated in the Constitution and By-Laws are: No person shall

represent the Confederated Tribes on the Council unless he is a duly enrolled member of the community who has attained the age of 21 years, and who has never been convicted of a major crime.

The apportionment, also from the Constitution, is: "Agency District, 3 elected members, one of whom shall represent the Sidwalter Flat area, together with the recognized chief of the District.

With the beginning of the new year, it is necessary that you make contact with the Personnel Department regarding your present status. If you are still actively looking for work, you must come in and complete a **New Job Application Form**. Using old applications has created

various problems so we are now requiring all applicants to complete a new form every 3 months.

In addition, you must make frequent contact at least every 2 weeks with the Personnel Department which includes the CETA Program and the Kah-Nee-Ta Personnel Office. This will keep us up-to-date on your employment status. Either telephone Personnel: extensions 265-268, or come in to the office in person and talk to us.
