W.S. hosts smoker

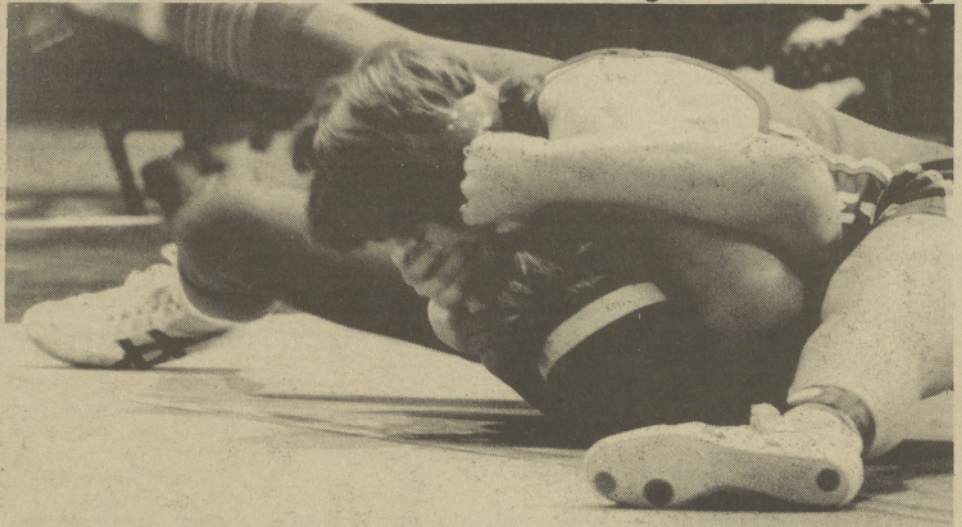

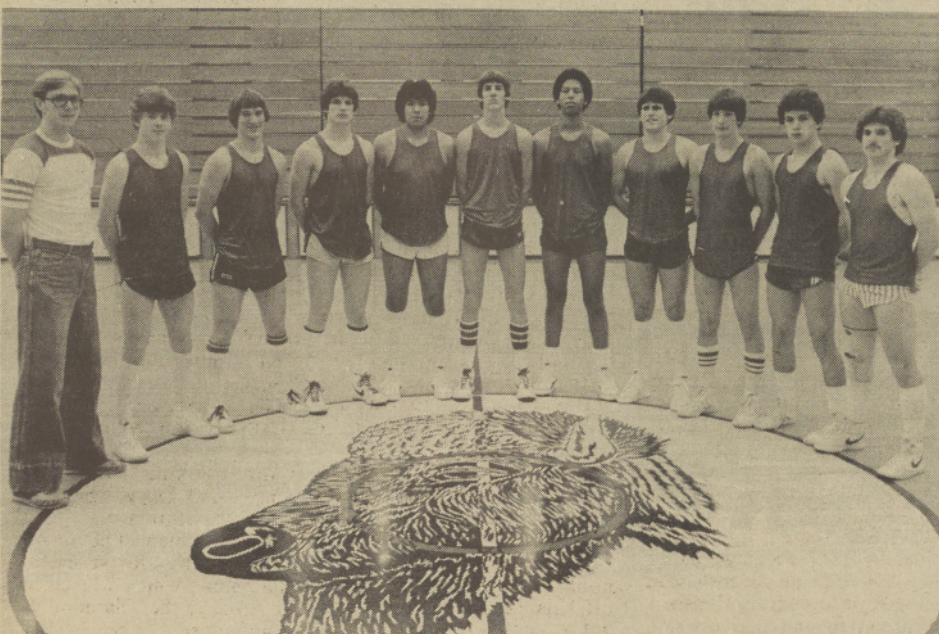
present a special performance during the program should contact the Native American Club.
