**Federal Indian Law** is characterized by certain abiding principles: Tribal sovereignty, Federal power and obligations, Reserved rights... As harmonized as the essential doctrines of Indian Law may be and as solid as the footing for Indian rights may seem at first, resistance to and denials of Indian rights are widespread. Indian law must be perceived as a dynamic field, responding to changes in national policy and needs. Perhaps the price of being characterized by exceptional doctrines is being exceptionally vulnerable to change."

**Cases and materials in Federal Indian Law, Getches, Rosenfelt, Wilkinson**

Howard Arnett, tribal attorney, will instruct on alternate Tuesday evenings, beginning April 5. The subjects to be addressed on the five different evenings are: 1. History of federal Indian policy and origins of federal Indian Law 2. State and Federal jurisdiction in Indian country 3. Tribal jurisdiction and tribal sovereignty 4. Indian water rights 5. Hunting and fishing rights.

providing legal aid and treaty fishing rights counsel. Previous to working in Warm Springs, he spent several years working on the Navajo reservation in legal aid. His boss then, was Peterson Zah, who was recently elected to be Navajo tribal council chairman.

Arnett's interest in Indian law began while at University of Oregon Law School in a Federal Indian Law class led by Mr. Charles Wilkinson. Arnett's education background include a degree from Stanford University and London School of Economics. His class will be characterized by lecture, discussion and question and answer time.

inspiration and joy. "I love cooking. That's my hobby you can say."

The class will be held in the 4-H room for six Wednesdays, from 12:00 noon to 1:00 p.m. and two, three-hour Saturday sessions. In addition to the \$12.00 tuition charge, there will be a \$3.00 food supply charge for each session.

**Crafts for seniors:** Chinette Fischer will travel here from Metolius to teach people how to make a number of different quick crafts. These items may be used as give-away gifts, for bazaars or in the home. People who sign up may choose from a number of different items including, padded picture frames, pin cushions, barrets made of lace ribbon and flowers.

The class will be held for four, two-hour sessions on Thursday, at the Senior building. The class is not limited to seniors and anyone in the community may join in. The class will require a total of 12 people. Fischer will be at the Senior Building at noon, March 25 to show samples of her work.

**Ukrainian eggs:** Chinette Fischer has mastered the ancient art of egg decoration. During this one-day, six-hour class, she will lecture on the history and meaning of the designs used in this art form. For centuries in the Ukraine, decorated eggs have been taken to churches to be blessed on Easter morning. Designs are symbolic: bands represent eternity, flowers stand for new life and growth, animals, such as deer or horses, are signs of prosperity. Fisher says that Indian designs could be beautifully incorporated in the wax and dye technique utilized. The eggs are often used to hang on Christmas trees.

**Greenhouse Designs:** Instructor Dennis Staines, of Sisters, has received several awards for his greenhouse designs. He will impart to students a knowledge of basic solar concepts, as well as information on designing and building a solar greenhouse. This is a one-night, three-hour class.

The following week, a one-night, three-hour class called, **Greenhouse Management**, instructor Martin Zimmerman, will be offered. This course will cover the fundamentals of greenhouse operation. Zimmerman will discuss types of greenhouses and coldframes, climate control, soil management, fertility and irrigation, insect and disease control and propagation. The cost for each of these classes is \$3.00.
