Creditor's claims against Indian estate should be fully itemized since the account was last paid in full, giving dates, items and charges of all purchases or services rendered, dates and amounts of all payments on account, and the unpaid balance. Claims must be filed in triplicate, verified by affidavit (also in triplicate) either with the Superintendent or the Administrative Law Judge on or before the date of hearing and prior to the time of hearing or during the hearing itself. Persons interested in any estate, as creditor or otherwise, are invited to attend the meeting.

contract health care would be provided to tribal members only. "Non-Indian spouses (male or female) and other non-Indian members of an Indian household are no longer eligible" for services, said a statement issued in mid-January.

Shortly after the passage of

the FY 1983 Interior appropriations legislation, which contained language eliminating IHS services to non-Indians, some Service Units sent out notification letters advising Indian non-tribal members that they were no longer eligible for IHS services. These denial letters have been rescinded.

## Science Fair shows ingenuity

The Madras High School Alternative Education Program in Warm Springs presented a Science Fair on Monday, April 25, 1983, sponsored by the American Indian Science and Engineering Society, through the University of Colorado in Boulder.

One of AISES's goals is a national effort to stimulate and generate interest in the

scientific and technical fields of study in Indian people. Through the sponsorship of science fairs, in 13 school with large Native American student populations, students will become motivated toward scientific and/or technological careers.

Five Warm Springs Alternative Schools students presented projects at the fair, held in a classroom at the

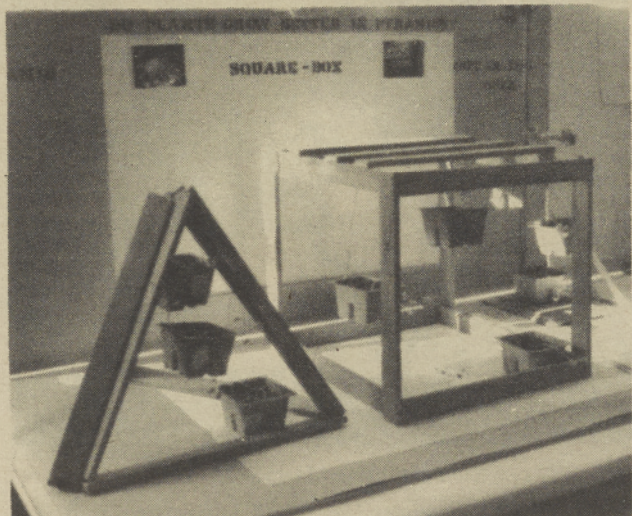
Alternative Education facility.

In the Natural Science Category, Sabrena Boyd, an eighth grader, won first place for her project, "Determination of the Growth Rate of Radish Seeds Under Different Colored Light Filters." There were two second place awards. Cherilyn Starr, tenth grader, presented "The Effect of Rock and Soil Music on a Hamster," and Tammy Smith for her project, "Effect of Pyramid Energy on Plant Growth." Clint Smith, a senior, won third place with his project: "Effects of Length of Day on the Sun's Shadow Angle and Length."

In Behavioral Science Category, Judy Williams, eleventh grader, won first place with a study on the "Association of Different Colors with Emotions."

Projects were judged by: Ann Card from the University of Colorado and Director of the AISES Science Fair Project; Lee Loomis from the Warm Springs Public Health Department; Gary White, fish biologist, from the Warm Springs fish Hatchery; and C.J. Bryan forest manager from the Umatilla Indian Reservation.

Students were aided by the Alternative Education staff members: Rob Hastings, Ned Hurtado, Lisbet Hornung and Elizabeth Hayes.

## Rabies clinic May 17

Dr. Melvin Boggs of the Madras Veterinary Clinic will sponsor a rabies vaccination clinic for cats and dogs on Tuesday, May 17, from 4:30 to 6 p.m. at the Warm Springs Fire Hall.

Cats should receive the vaccination every year, and dogs every three years. Animals must be at least four months of age.

Cats are to be carried in cartons or bags, and dogs must be on a leash.

This is a good opportunity to save on costs, as vaccination ordinarily costs \$9, but at this clinic, the fee will be only \$4. Licenses for animals can also be obtained at this time.
