To the Editor,

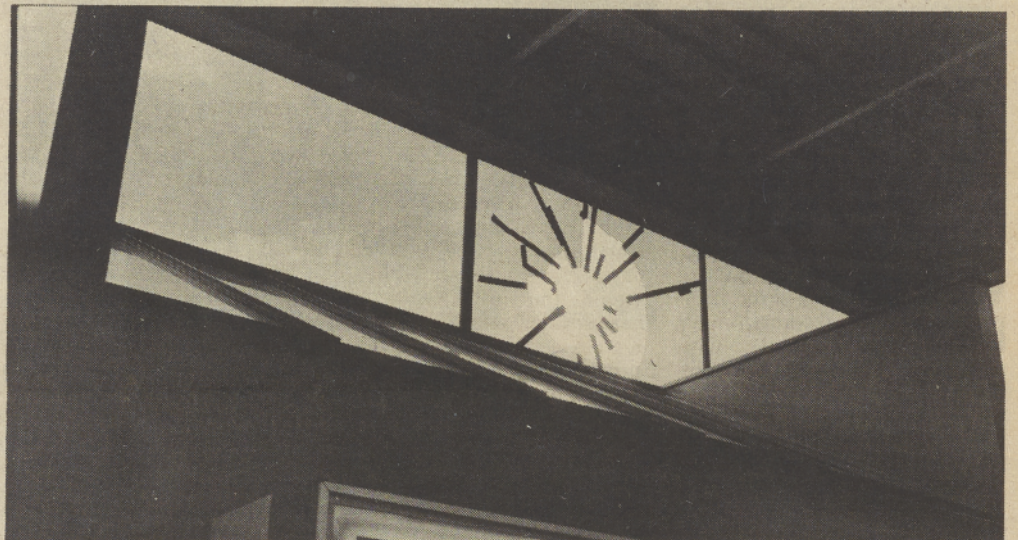
The St. Jude's Children's Bike-a-thon that the Warm Springs Parents Club had on Saturday, April 30 raised \$314.70.
