Bufs coast to easy victory

During the past week, the Nebraska Corn Huskers beat the Minnesota Gophers by the score of 84-13, in an obviously one-sided game. One could compare the football game between the Chemawa Braves and the Madras White Buffaloes to the Nebraska/Minnesota game.

On September 16, on the White Buffaloes' home field, the Chemawa team of Salem came to town and ran into a stone wall as the Buff's posted an easy 37-7 non-conference football game win.

Chemawa, winning the coin toss, elected to receive and were held on successive downs and were forced to punt giving the Buff's good field position. It took just two plays to score as Anthony David broke loose and scampered down the left sideline on a 54-yard run to score the first touchdown. Williams kicked the extra point giving the Buff's a 7-0 lead. From that point on, the Buff's went on a rampage scoring on runs, passes and a 25-yard field goal by Scott Williams, and went into the locker room with a 30-0 half time lead.

Early in the third quarter, Davis ran in from four yards out to cap the Buff scoring for the night. The reserves all got in on the action from that point on. Locals who saw plenty of action were Dan Lawrence, reserve quarterback called the signals, Tyrone Ike, Jason Palmer and David Lucei saw plenty of defensive action, and hard running by sophomore Tony Nathan proved there is young talent coming up in the

back field. Alvis Smith III connected on a pass that covered 33 yards. Eric Miller saw action on both offense and defense. Up front in the line, Joe Smith gave the visitors a tough time. Taking a breather in the second half were regulars Hobo Patt, Cy Jim, Jason Smith and Anson Begay.

The visitors, despite the disadvantage in size, weight and experience, should be complimented as they showed some good talent in the hard running of Wilfred Lawrence, the 5'10", 160-pound senior. With some decent blocking, Lawrence could give any team a lot of trouble, he was a threat each time he got the ball and much of the yardage he gained was by his own efforts, sometimes taking a host of Buff defenders to stop him.

Kenny Little George, the 135-pound senior quarterback did a fine job in handling the ball and running. The whole team effort and spirit was high throughout the game even with the one-sided score. It was Lawrence who scored the lone touchdown for the visitors and Little George adding the extra point with his kick.

The Buff's have a bye on the 23rd and then on September 30, they host St. Mary's of Medford, Oregon, in the final non-conference game before the Greater Oregon league gets underway.

On October 7, the Buffs will travel to Vale for their first conference game. The Vale Vikings are always tough in the GOL, this could be one of the biggest tests for the Buffs.

St. Pat's Cowdeo Oct. 15-16

The St. Pat's Cowdeo is scheduled for October 15-16, 1983, in the indoor rodeo arena at Madras.

This event is for the little guys and gals to show what they can do in the rodeo arena, especially for those who do not have the opportunity to participate in rodeos all the time. All participants cannot be in the top five in standings with any organization such as the pee wee, junior or high school rodeo clubs, the All-Indian or Oregon Barrel Racing Association or any other rodeo association.

The events will include sheep riding for kids ages 5-6 year

olds, limited to 26 entries, calf riding for ages 7-10 and 11-12 and cow riding for the 13-14 year olds.

Other events are break-away calf roping and ribbon roping, the scurry race and barrel racing. The division will be divided into three categories, the pee wee ages 6-9, juniors ages 10-12 and seniors 13-14.

The horseless roping will be divided into two sections one for the pee wee and the other for the juniors. All kids must use their own horse, no two kids are allowed to use the same horse in any of the events.

There will be door prizes for the general public. A paid

admission entitles anyone for the drawing for the door prize. Tickets will also be on sale for the drawing. The first prize will be half beef, second prize a whole pork, third prize a hind quarter of beef, fourth prize a front quarter of beef and the fifth prize is a radio. The all-around champion will receive a pair of chaps put up by Olsen's Saddle Shop.

The admission is \$2.00 per person; children under school age will be admitted free. The show time is on Saturday 7:30 p.m. and on Sunday 1:30 p.m.

All contestants with horses at rodeos are required to ride in the Grand Entry, those failing to do so will be fined.
