



Locals headed for Nationals

Two locals are going to the Indian National Finals Rodeo which will be held on November 10-13, 1983, in the Tingley Coliseum, New Mexico State Fair Grounds, Albuquerque, New Mexico.

A brother and sister combination of Terry and C.R. Squiemphen will be making their bids for a world title. This will be Terry's first appearance at the finals. He qualified for saddle bronc competition ending up the season setting in second place on point standings in the Western States Indian Rodeo Association.

This will be C.R.'s second appearance at the National Finals. She made her first trip in 1981, and this year finishing second highest in point standings at the end of the season qualified her for the girls barrel racing event.

At the end of the season contestants must finish in the top two positions in the rodeo's

six major events and barrel racing to qualify for the finals.

True competitors both Terry and C.R. work hard at the rodeo game in their respective events and all season long the competition is tough. But their high competitive spirit and determination is what paid off for them, and they will be competing with the top cowboys and cowgirls from throughout U.S. and Canada.

center Gym at 1009 East McLoughlin Blvd., Vancouver, Washington.

All contestants must show his USA/ABF card and proof of age with a birth certificate or immigration form. Failure to furnish proper documentation will eliminate contestant from competition. All boxers must

show signature of parents or legal guardian giving consent to participate.

Age and weight divisions are sub novice, no bouts; novice, 1-5 bouts; junior division, ages 10-11; weights from 60 to 115 pounds; intermediate division, ages 12-13; weights 70 up to 147 pounds; senior division, ages 14-15, weights 80 to 178 and heavy weights; senior division, ages 16 and up, weights 106 to 178; heavy weights 178 to 200 pounds; special senior 0-5 bouts, ages 16 and up weights 106 to 178; heavy weights from 178 to 200 pounds and super heavy weights over 200 pounds.
