Youngdeer transferred to Aberdeen, South Dakota. Moving from state to state has been a part of BIA superintendent Merrit Youngdeer's life since he was a child. His father being in the military service moved regularly. Youngdeer who has been the superintendent here for the past two years transferred to Aberdeen, to serve as the area's assistant director for administration.

**Timber tours viewing future logging units were done during the months of August.**

Timber tours viewing future logging units were done during the month of August. Areas toured were the Sheep Creek Logging Unit, Shitike Canyon Logging Unit, the Old Mill logging Unit, Beaver Creek Canyon, East Camas and the Powerline Logging Unit. Controversy rises on two logging units. The Shitike Canyon and the Beaver Canyon Logging units. An Environmental Impact Statement should be prepared before the Shitike Canyon, Shitike Butte Timber sale is approved. The Natural Resources stated that water quality of Shitike Creek downstream of sale units



will be detrimentally affected. The economic return to the Tribes from this sale will be minimal. To risk inflicting irreparable damage to Shitike Creek and its associated resources for such a small profit is questionable. Public meetings on the two sites were held in both the Simnasho and Agency Longhouses.

**Tribes propose to tax reservation vendors.**

Tribes propose to tax reservation vendors. The Warm Springs Tribal Code, Chapter 700, Business Privilege Tax and the establishment of a Tribal Tax through Ordinance 64 and adopted by Tribal Council April 27, 1982. The Tribe has had, for years, the right to tax. Up until now, it has been limited to non-Indian vendors who came on the reservation to do business, who in the past had to purchase annually a \$25 business license from the tribal vital statistics department.

Museum becoming a reality. Through a charter adopted in 1975, the Mid-Oregon Indian Historical Society (MOIHS) was formed. MOIHS has been actively seeking artifacts of significant value to the Warm Springs Tribe since 1974, and to date over 1,600 artifacts have been acquired either through donation or purchase.

The White Buffaloes had a successful football season winning the league title and going to the state play-offs.
