Bufs top Cowboys

The Madras White Buffaloes upped their basketball record to 8-2 so far this season after beating Crook County 58-48, last Tuesday night on the Madras home court.

Phil Fine topped all scorers for the night with 17 points leading the Buffs to their second win over the Cowboys this year. The Buffs took an early lead and were never in any serious trouble all evening. The Cowboys did close the gap to three points late in the game but that was about all they could do as the Buffs jumped ahead at the closing moments of the game.

Ken Hausinger hit with a turn around jump shot to get the Buffs started in their romp. Madras went ahead by nine

points before the visiting Cowboys could get their first basket.

Scott Williams and Hausinger each added 14 points, Ray Waldorf 5, and Mike Boggs and Cy Jim each four points, to round out the scoring for the Buffs. Pollard lead the Cowboy attack with 12 points.

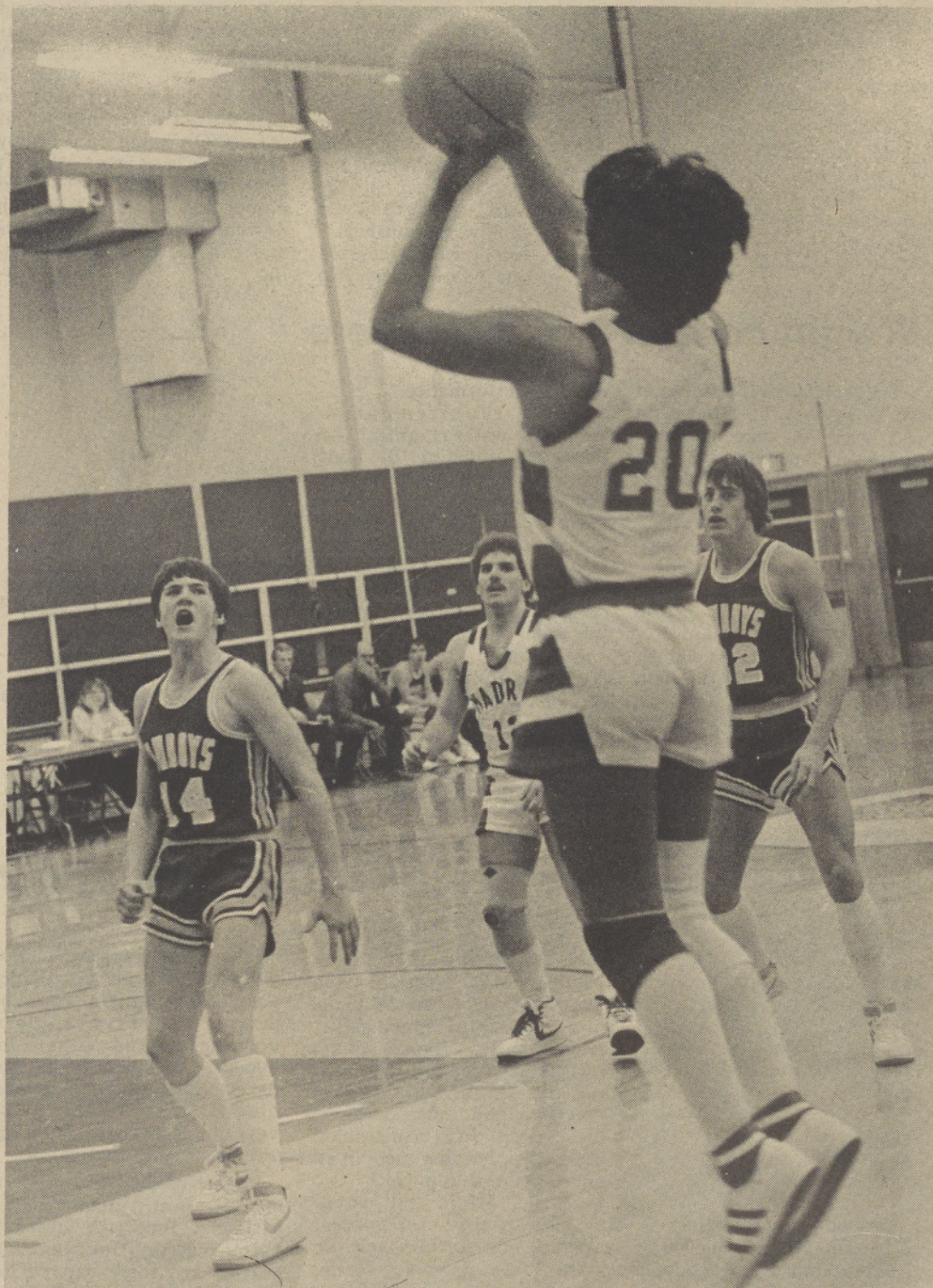

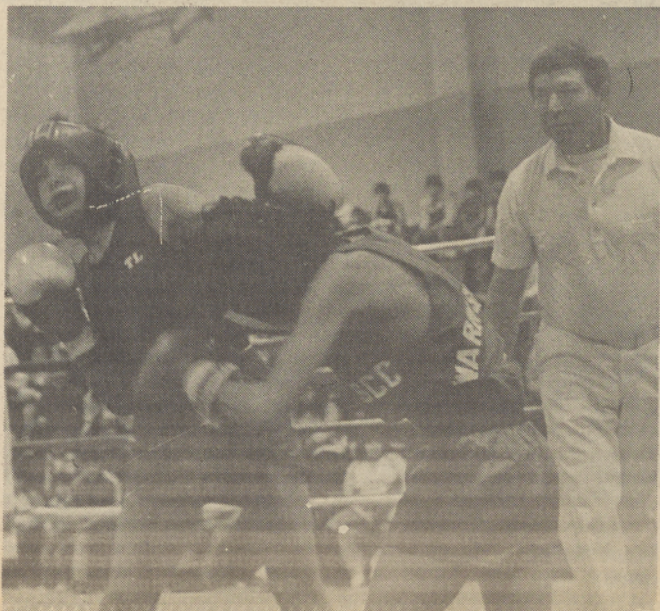
