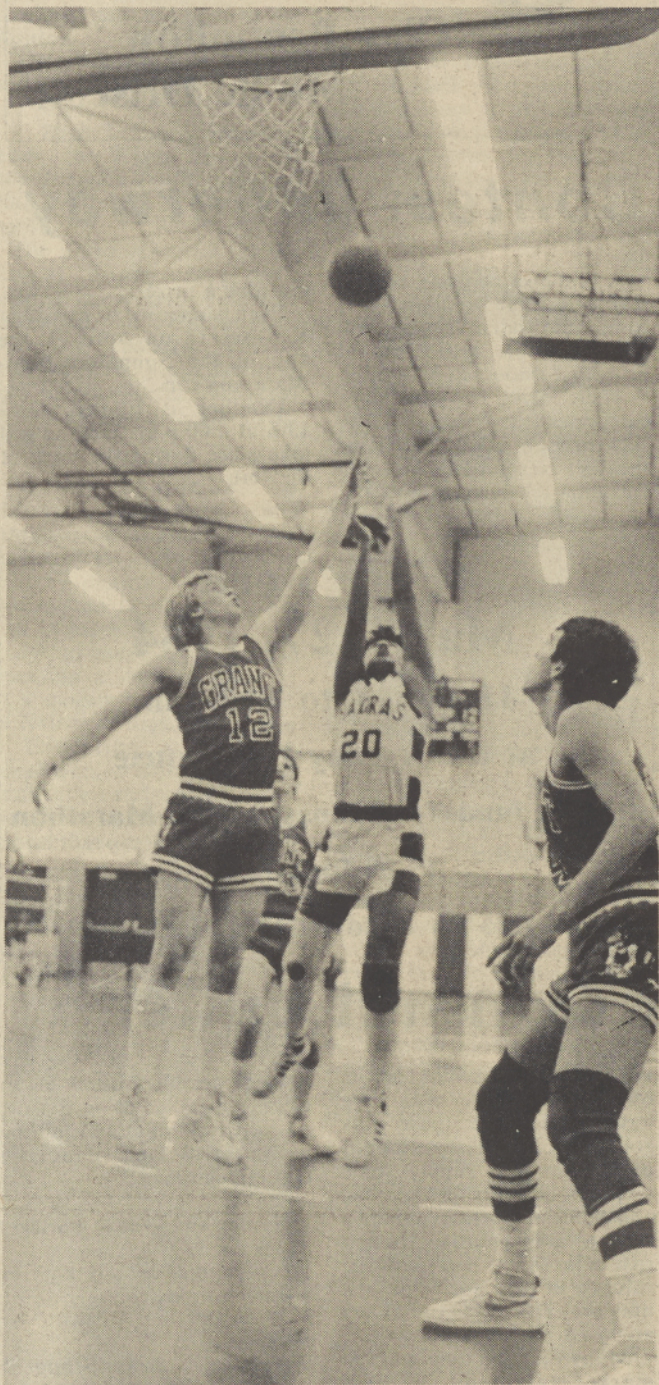

Buffaloes win first consolation game

Madras White Buffaloes came out in the lead in their second game during AA Boys League Playoffs at MacArthur Court in Eugene. Their first game ended any chance for first place as they suffered a defeat of 54-48 by Clatskanie.

Playing Central High Panthers the Buffaloes took the

lead ending the first and second quarters 20-12 and 33-32. Central turned around and took the lead 48-47 in the third quarter.

Yakima All-Indian bowling tourney set
