25, 1983, and/or January 25, 1983, approved membership rolls of the Tribes; or

(B) They were living on February 18, 1975, but are now deceased, and their names appeared on the March 25, 1975, and/or February 25, 1975, approved membership rolls of Tribes; and

(C) They have not participated in: 1) The distribution to the Malheur Paiutes under the provisions of the act approved August 20, 1964 (78 Stat. 563). 2) A distribution pursuant to any other judgement under the act approved August 13, 1946 (25 U.S.C. 70 ET SEQ.), or 3) Any distribution under the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act (43 U.S.C. 1601 ET SEQ.)

3. Who will receive the share of an eligible applicant who has died?

The per capita share of a deceased individual shall be distributed to the heir or beneficiary under a will of such individual in accordance with regulations prescribed by the Secretary and the probate code of the Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs Reservation. In the event such individual dies intestate without heirs, the per capita share of the individual shall escheat to the Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs Reservation.

4. How much will an eligible applicant receive?

This cannot be answered until the final payment roll is

madeup. The amount will be determined by dividing the total amount for each judgement award by the number of eligible applicants.

5. When will payment be made?

It is impossible to estimate payment date. Having gone through the appeal process, ending February 16, 1984, 67 appeals have been submitted. All appeals must be settled before a payment roll can be prepared. Each appeal that is considered ineligible must be processed through the Superintendent, Area Director and the Assistant Secretary. The decision of the Assistant Secretary on the appeal shall be final and conclusive and written notice of the decision shall be given the appellant.

6. When will minor children receive their shares?

The per capita share of an individual under the age of eighteen or individuals determined by the Secretary to be incompetent to handle his own affairs shall be: (A) Distributed in accordance with such procedures as the Secretary determines to be necessary to protect the interests of such individual, or (B) In the discretion of the Secretary, held in trust for the benefit of such individual.

Youngsters can assemble kit

A youngster can easily assemble a suitable first aid kit for your car or home.

All you need for your child to construct a first aid kit are a sturdy box to contain supplies such as a shoe box, plastic tackle box or a lunch box and first aid equipment and

supplies.

Suggested first aid kit contents include a roll of two-inch adhesive tape, antiseptic, triangular bandages and other dressings such as gauze in individual packages, small scissors, sterile cotton and cotton swabs, a quarter for a

phone call and American Red Cross first aid book.

Items in the first aid kits should be neatly assembled. The inside of the kit's lid should have a list of supplies and the top of the kit should be marked "First Aid Kit" for easy identification.

Judge Boldt dies of pneumonia

Judge George H. Boldt, retired U.S. District judge, died of pneumonia Sunday, March 18 in a Seattle hospital. Boldt was well known for his 1974 Indian fishing decision which affected many Northwest residents.

Boldt's name became synonymous with the issue for ruling that an 1855 treaty between Indian Tribes and the federal government gave Indian fisherman the right to half of the salmon and steelhead bound for waters in Western Washington.

Boldt quoted from the landmark decision of U.S. District Judge Robert Belloni,

who, in 1969, ordered that four Columbia River treaty tribes (Yakima, Warm Springs, Umatilla and Nez Perce) were entitled to a fair share of the Columbia River salmon and steelhead runs.

Boldt expanded the Belloni decision to apply to Western Washington and changed "fair share" to 50 percent of harvestable fish. Belloni later stated that Boldt's decision and interpretation should apply to the Columbia runs also.

The State of Washington Supreme Court found the Boldt's ruling unconstitutional, but the U.S. Supreme Court upheld the ruling 1979, five

years after Boldt's ruling and just three months after Boldt retired from U.S. District Court.

He was born to a Swedish immigrant in Chicago in December, 1903. The family moved to Stevensville, Montana where he was raised and attended school. He received his law degree from the University of Montana in 1926.

In 1953, he was appointed to the U.S. District Court in Tacoma, Washington by President Eisenhower and became chief judge of the Western Washington district in 1971.

Boldt was known for his gathering of information firsthand on Indian reservations and the Indian fishing areas. He was known for other areas of his judicial works but to Indian people he was known for his ruling on Indian fishing rights giving Indians 50 percent of harvestable fish.

He once commented on his "unpopularity" among non-Indians for his fishing decision, "It is not essential or even necessarily desirable factor that a conscientious judge should even consider public acceptance of a ruling."

Judge George Boldt, is a judge who will live long in the memories and minds of Indian people of America.
