Positions available through YCC

The Forest, in cooperation with the Oregon State Department of Employment is recruiting to fill ten (10) vacancies in the Youth Conservation Corps (YCC). There will be three positions on the Bend ranger District, two positions at the Fort Rock Ranger District, three on the Sisters Ranger District, one on the Crescent Ranger District, and one at the Redmond Air Center. Work is out-of-doors performing forest jobs including slash disposal,

trail maintenance, and campground cleanup.

Applicants must be 15 by June 1 but not over 19 by August 30 and must live within 35 miles of the work site.

The positions will start in mid-June and last approximately eight weeks. Pay is at the current minimum wage of \$3.35/hour. All applicants for the Bend, Fort Rock, and Crescent job should apply at the Oregon State Employment Office at 2150 NE Studio

Road, 388-6070. Sisters District and Redmond Air Center applicants should contact the Oregon State Employment office in Redmond at 541 South Seventh, 548-8196. Applications will be accepted from April 10 through April 25.

A public drawing (at a later date) will select the participants. Applications are available only at the Bend and Redmond Employment offices and at the Crescent Ranger District.

Low income families eligible for help

Low income persons who have not applied for help from the federal energy aid program might still be able to get assistance with this winter's fuel bill.

Additional money approved by Congress for the Low Income Energy Assistance Program was released only recently and Central Oregon distribution points still are taking applications for the one-time aid.

Joyce Embery, LIEAP Coordinator of the Central Oregon Council on Aging

(COCOA), which oversees distribution of the money for Central Oregon, said the program has been extended to April 30, or until the funds are used. Central Oregon received \$125,000 of the additional \$2.5 million allocated for Oregon. COCOA's total allocation for this winter's program is \$975,000.

To be eligible a one person's household's income may be no greater than \$506.00 per month or \$6075.00 per year; two person households: \$681.00 per month or \$8175.00 per year and

for each additional household member add \$2100.00 per year.
