Roadrunners second at Nationals

The Northwest Roadrunners of Simnasho, Oregon, were the runner-up at the first annual 40 year old and over national basketball tournament held over the weekend of April 4-6, 1984 in Ft. Hall, Idaho.

The roster consisted of Louie Belgard, Mike Wertin, Jerome Main, Uren Leonard, Ricky Minthorn, Jim Macy, and manager Franklin "Chin" Suppah.

The long trip had its effects on the team as it showed in the first game as the lead changed several times. It was not until the final quarter when the guys got their act together to hold off Arizona's rally and post a 77-70 win. Minthorn led all scorers with 25 points, others contributing to the scoring were Jim Macy 19, Wertin 16, Belgard 10, Leonard 4, Main 2. It was Lugo and Sugar who led the Arizona attack each scoring 21 points apiece, Megerett 13, Biakeddy 11, White 2, and Track 2.

The second game was perhaps tougher than the first game with Nez Perce-Umatilla of Pendleton, because of previous meetings with this team. It was an all around

performance from the whole team of solid ball playing, sportsmanship and a good bench that made the difference to give them a 78-66 win to put them in for the championship game. Leading scorer for Simnasho was Wertin with 36, Macy 21, Minthorn 8, Belgard 6, Main 5, Chin 2. For Pendleton, Webb scored 29, Seth 26, Cowapoo 6, McCormack 4, Tias 1.

In the championship game with Ft. Hall, the Roadrunners were out manned in height as well as depth on the bench but with good team effort they made a good game out of it going down in defeat by the score 74-53. The game was a lot closer than the final score indicated. The whole team made a good showing for this being the first tournament for the older group.

Making the all star list from the Simnasho Roadrunners were Jim Macy and Mike Wertin. The final standings of the tourney was: 1st Ft. Hall, Idaho; 2nd. Simnasho Roadrunners; 3rd. Ft. Washakie, Wyoming; 4th Pendleton-Nez Perce.

Warm Springs rodeo set for April 21, 22

Spring has arrived in Warm Springs. If you have any doubts take a close look at the weather. A sure sign of spring is to have sunshine, rain and snow all in the same day. With the arrival of spring comes the first rodeo of the season in this area, the Annual Spring Warm Springs Rodeo, formerly known as the Root Feast Rodeo. The rodeo will be held April 21 and 22 at the Warm Springs Agency rodeo grounds.

The rodeo books will open for contestants Monday, April 16 at 5:30 p.m. and close Thursday, April 19. Rodeo office hours during that time will be 5:30 to 8 p.m. only. Entries can be mailed to Ginger

Johnson, Rodeo Secretary, P.O. Box 541, Warm Springs, Oregon 97761. All mail entries must be received by the rodeo office by 5 p.m. on Thursday, April 19. The rodeo office will accept only cash or money orders for payment of fees; no personal checks. The rodeo office telephone number is (503) 553-1750.

Rodeo events are saddle bronc, entry fee \$40, added purse of \$100; bareback, entry fee \$40, added purse \$40, added purse \$100; team roping, entry fee \$40 per man, two loops, enter twice, added purse \$200; breakaway roping, entry fee \$25, added purse \$100; and wild horse race, entry fee \$75

per team added purse \$100. All events are one go.

The rodeo will start daily at 1 p.m. Admission will be charged, adults-\$3, children-\$1.50 and senior citizens-free. The rodeo association will have a concession at the rodeo grounds.

For team ropers there will be team roping on Saturday, April 21 at the Jefferson County Fairgrounds in Madras during the evening. Sign-up time for the Madras roping will start at 5 p.m. with the roping starting at 6 p.m. For more information contact Bob Miller, (503) 546-5431; Buster Bain, (503) 548-6241; or Tim Messner, (503) 548-7324.

Forms are available at the Warm Springs Extension office, Warm Springs Elementary and the Community Center. In Madras they are available at Oscar's Sporting Goods.

Entry fee for all the runs is

\$8.00. Entrants will receive a raffle ticket, swim ticket and a specially designed Simnasho Mini-Marathon hand towel.

All runs, 3 mile, 6 mile and 13 mile begin at 10:00 a.m. ending at the Kah-Nee-Ta village parking lot. Buses will transport runners to the starting lines.

Awards will be presented to first and second place winners,

male and female, in five age categories including; 13 and under; 14-18 years of age; 19-29; 30-39; and 40 plus.
