Chief Schonchin Days powwow

The 21st annual Chief
Schonchin Days Powwow and
All-Indian rodeo in Klamath
Falls, Oregon, will be held
Saturday, May 26 and Sunday,
May 27 at the Klamath Falls
county fairgrounds. The two-
day rodeo is sanctioned by
Western States Indian Rodeo
Association (WSIRA).

Events for the rodeo will
include saddle bronc,
bareback, bull riding, calf
roping, wild cow milking, team
roping, kids steer riding and
barrel racing. Stalls will be
available for a \$5 charge.

Featured in the powwow will
be men's fancy and traditional
dance; women's fancy and
traditional dance; teen boys
and girls dance; boys and girls
dance (7-12 years of age); tiny
tots (six and under years of
age); and owl dance.

A parade will be held
Saturday morning. On
Sunday, church services will
be held at the fairground
grandstand at 10 a.m.

An arts and crafts show will
be held in the Exhibit Building
at the fairgrounds both
Saturday and Sunday.

The Sisters Rodeo Associa-
