Sampson of Glenwood, Washington with 30.04 and sixth place went to Edison Yazzi of White Swan, Washington with 30.09.

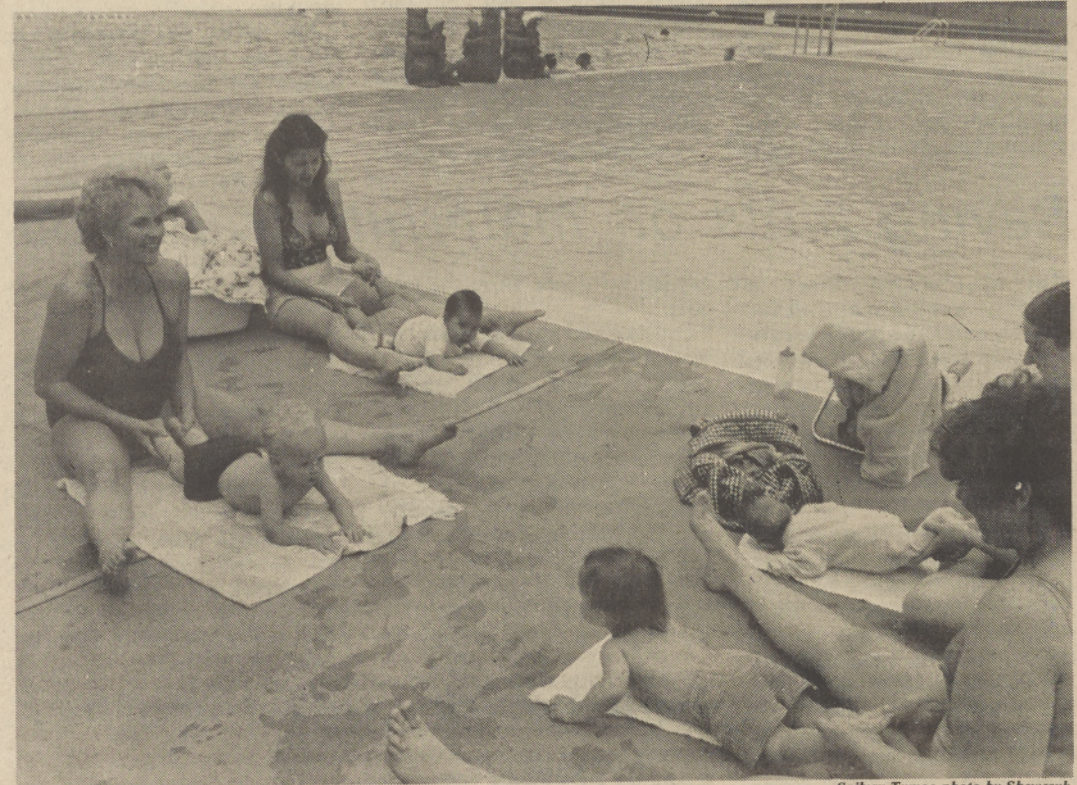
