Final Eddie Cole Memorial Rodeo August 25-26

The third and final Eddie "Mannkins" Cole Memorial rodeo held at Shad and Jack adley's rodeo grounds will be held August 25 and 26.

The rodeo has been sponsored by Shad Shadley, a nephew of the late Eddie Cole. Cole was a well-known roper in the world of rodeo, and in his younger days, as a saddle bronc rider.

It is a rodeo that has earned the reputation of offering something for everyone with the rough ride events, the timed events and special featured races of a watermelon race, a fat men's foot race, a fat lady's relay race, and a kid's foot race. The Shadley family planned the rodeo as one in which Cole himself would have enjoyed participating.

The rodeo books will open Saturday, August 25 at 8 a.m. and close at noon, they will

open on Sunday, August 26 at 8 a.m. and close at noon. A new feature in entering this year is that contestants may enter for both days. All entry fees must be paid in cash. A stock fee of \$2 per entry will be drawn from the entry fee. An "All-Around Cowboy" buckle and an "All-Around Cowgirl" buckle will be awarded.

Featured in the rodeo will be saddle bronc, bareback, calf roping, team roping, barrel racing, girls cow riding and wild horse race.

Show time for each day will be 1:30 p.m. An admission charge of \$2 per person will be charged.

On Sunday, August 26 following the rodeo a free bar-b-que will be held for spectators and contestants. For a weekend of good "down home" fun, plan to attend the memorial rodeo as a contestant or spectator.

The Oregon Little League District 5 tournament held here in Warm Springs got under way Wednesday evening starting at 3:30 p.m.

The first round of action saw the Redmond team square off with its neighboring town of Sisters. Redmond went on to win the contest by the score of 10-2. Co. boys in the loser bracket.

Thursday morning at 10:30 a.m. Redmond continued on its winning ways getting by Columbia 3-1. In a game at 1:00 p.m. The Dalles American team defeated Hood River 8-7 to stay in the winner's bracket. Hermiston held on to defeat Willow Creek 5-2.

All the games have been

intensely played with the widest margin in scoring coming in the game between Jeff. Co. and Hermiston and the game between Redmond and Sisters as both games had an eight point spread.

The Jeff. Co. boys were a little weary at bat, and were unable to get any good hits. The Hermiston team had some good pitching which kept them going all evening long against the Jeff. Co. boys.

On Friday morning starting at 10:00 a.m., there will be two games played from the loser bracket. One game will be between Hood River and Deschutes of Maupin, and the other team game will put the Jeff. Co. boys against Sisters. Starting at 1:00 p.m. Columbia will meet Willow Creek.

In the championship bracket starting at 3:30 p.m. The Dalles West will face Hermiston and at 6:00 p.m. Redmond will go against The Dalles American.
