General Jonathan Wainwright exchanged greetings with (pictured left to right) Chief Charley Quittocken of the Wy-Am tribe, Chief Tommy Thompson and his son Henry Thompson of the Celilo tribe on November 15, 1945 at The Dalles. Wainwright had expressed a desire to see Indians fishing for salmon at Celilo.

Memaloose Island in the Columbia River located opposite of Big Eddy, Oregon was used by the Columbia River Indians for the burial of their dead. Crude wooden shacks were erected and the dead were laid side by side on the floor. This photograph was taken about 1900.
