Activities planned for the indoor arena during fair week will start on Tuesday, August 7 with the 4-H horse judging contest Wednesday and Thursday the 4-H Horse Show will be held, Thursday night, August 9, the first stock dog exhibitions to be held at the fair will begin at 7:00 p.m. and will

be followed at 8:00 by the open cow horse contest which is open to residents of all counties. Friday, at 1:00 p.m., the arena will be the scene of the fun for all, Kid's scramble, at 7:00 the 1985 queen try outs horsemanship judging will be held, and will be followed at 7:30 by the Madras saddle club's open play day. Saturday and Sunday, August 11 and 12 at 1:30 p.m., Sombrero Stock Inc. will present an ORA approved rodeo. Saturday night the arena building turns into a huge dance hall and will feature the annual western fair dance with the fast-moving, western band called "Full-Tilt Boogie."

Rodeo tickets to Sombrero Stock Inc's ORA rodeo to be held at the Jefferson County Fair in Madras on Saturday and Sunday, August 11 and 12, are now available.

Jefferson County Fair and Rodeo Queen Becky Farrell and Princess Cindy Gibson will

Price of the tickets is \$3.00.

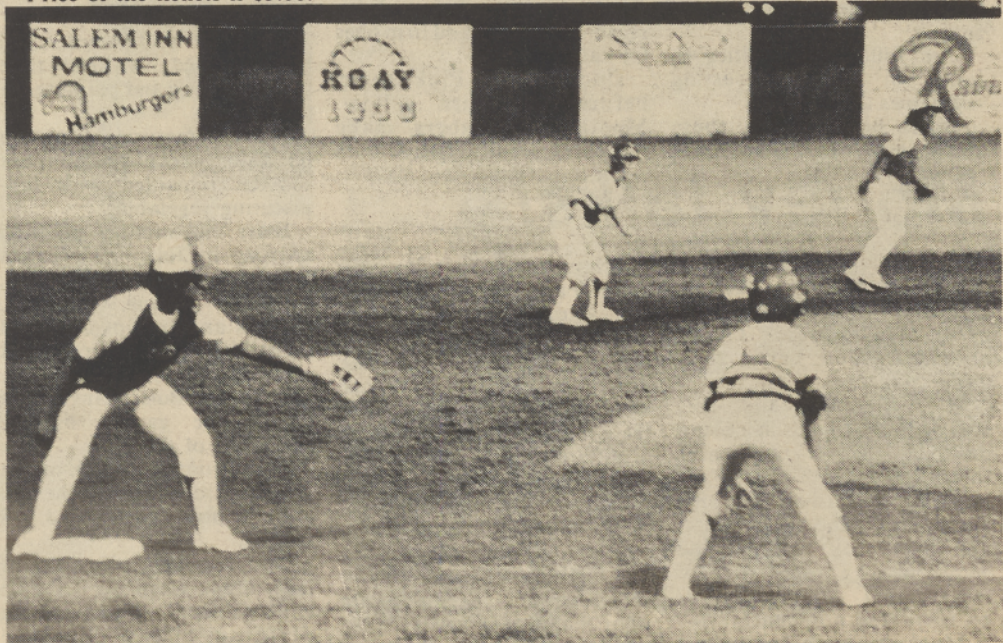
Co-ed tourney planned
