

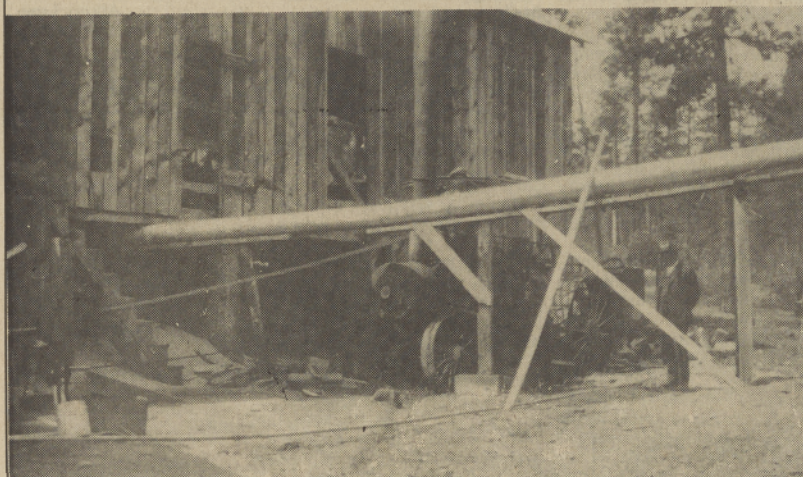
1920s logging practices depicted
