Nathan Main set the pace setting guard had several good assists and scoring 11 points for the victors while teammates Jay Madden had six Heydon one point to round out the scoring for the final game of the tournament.

Coach Blincoe said there are times when the boys let up a bit and they will have to work on that, to keep consistent through out the game.

The Burns Hilanders made their move in the second and third quarter where they played the Buffs pretty even where Steve Courtney led their scoring attack 14 points while teammates Woodworth 12 and Rothwell 10 for double figure scoring.

It was in the final quarter when the Buff moved away from the Hilanders out scoring them 25-9 where everything seemed to fall right in place.

In the first round the Hilanders ran away from White Salmon and the Buffs pounded the Lakeview Honkers. The White Salmon team came out all fired up to take third place in the tourney by just getting by Lakeview in a close game. The Buffs have looked impressive at time so far in the young season as they have ran their record of 5-0 to this point with Burns and Lakeview being their toughest opponents so far.

Thursday night the Bend Lava will come to Madras. The AAA school should be a real test for the Buffs. They have some fine

talent in Kees, Wack and Reay who do a lot of the scoring for them. The Lava Bears have had some good games with their Inter Mountain league opponents.

During the Madras Holiday tournament the Buffs missed several free shots which could make all the difference in games to come. The game with Bend will be the last home game for 1984. On Friday night they face another AAA school when the travel to Molalla and on Dec. 28-29, they will participate in the Hood River tournament.

The next home game will be on Jan. 8, when Crook County comes to town. This should be a pretty interesting year for the Buffs and hopefully a conference title.

Trophies will be given to six place winners. The champions will receive jackets along with the first place trophy. Satin jackets will go to the second place winners and third place

winners will receive hooded sweat-shirts. The fourth through sixth place winners will receive T-shirts as well as trophies. A sportsmanship trophy will be given to the team that displays good sportsmanship throughout the tournament. Those players that are voted all-stars will receive gym bags.

South Dakota will be the defending champions this year and will be among the favorites to win. According to Satch Miller, director of the holiday tournament, there will be five or six good, strong teams that will battle it out for the championship. "It'll be a good tour-

namment," said Miller.

Wednesday night before the last game of the evening, the new holiday tournament queen from the junior and senior courts will be crowned.

Other tournament activities include an exhibition of break-dancing and basketball skills by the boys and girls basketball teams coached by Fran Moses.

Saturday evening will be the championship game and awards ceremony. After the awards ceremony the holiday tournament raffle will begin.

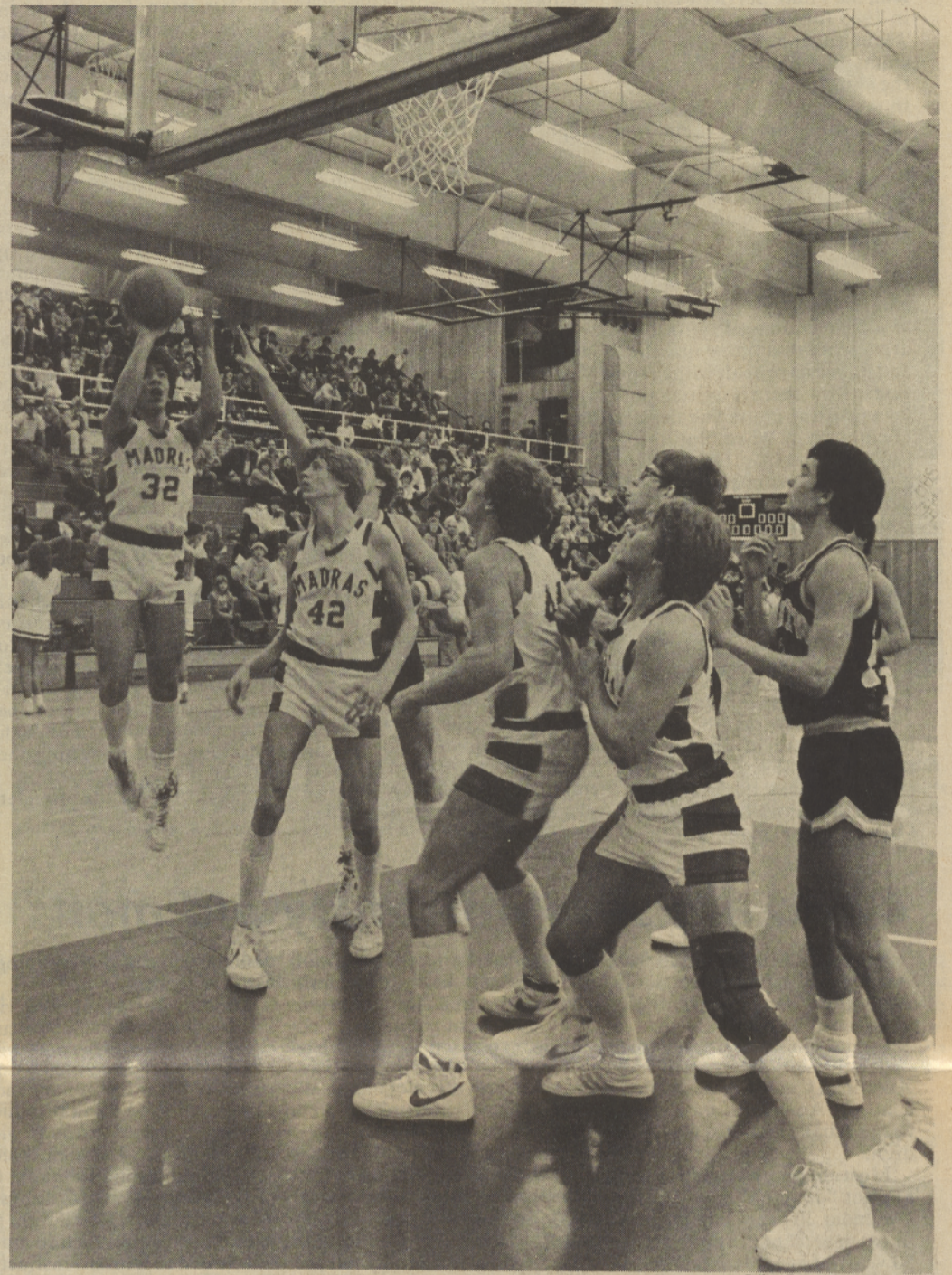
There will be drawings for raffle items at each session. For

the last session there will be three major prizes to be raffled off. Tickets are on sale at .50¢ apiece, five for \$1.40 for \$5, or 100 for \$10. You need not be present to be a winner.

There are rules governing the holiday tournament: Here are (3) three of the 15 rules. (1) Eligibility: Be 1/2 or more Indian Descent; a Tribal or BIA Employee and a member of the Warm Springs Bowling League; or a spouse to any of the above. (2) You must have a current ABC/WIBC card. Non-members may also qualify for entry and all ABC/WIBC services by paying an unattached membership fee of \$5 for men and \$2 for women or a \$1 participation fee. (3) Teams will consist of four members with one division for men and one for women at \$10 per

player. Doubles will be \$10 per player with two divisions for men (Division I Handicap 60 pins and under combines; Division II Handicap 61 pins and over combined and one for women. Participants must enter singles if entered in doubles. Singles cost \$10 to enter. Other events are mixed doubles at \$10 per player, all-events at \$2 per player, and Holiday Champ roll-off at \$3 per player. All prizes will be awarded on a handicap basis except a roll-off which is determined on a scratch basis from the first series scores in team; Doubles; and Singles. Please note you must bowl all these events plus pay entry fee to be a finalist.

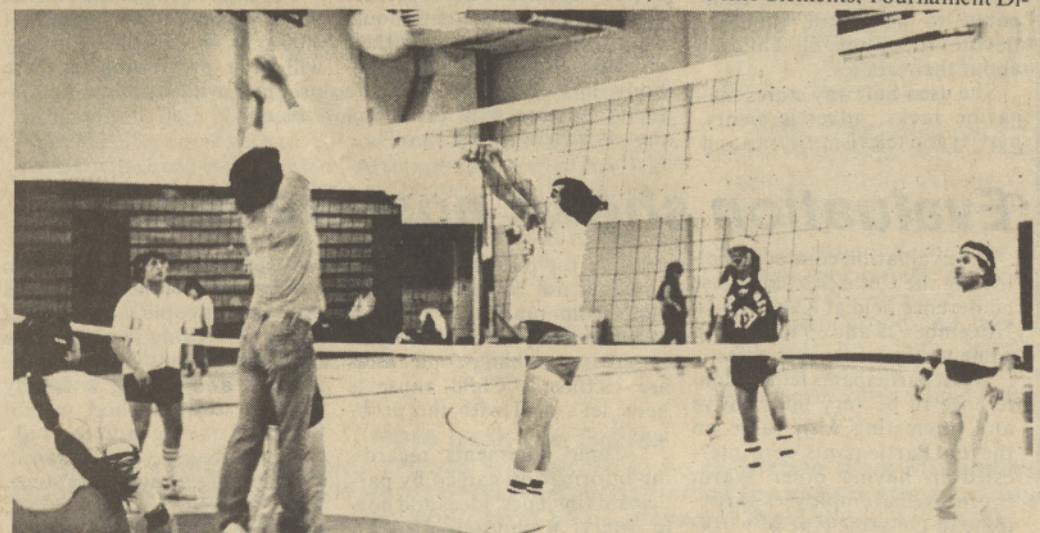
