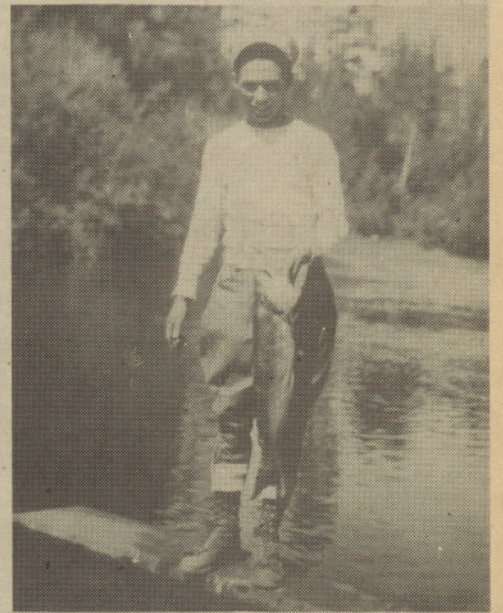

The Root Feast Ceremonial Fishery was conducted April 1, 2 and 3 in the Cascade Locks area of the Columbia River. Pictured (left to right) are Thane Colwash, head fisherman Bruce Jim and Olin Charley.

This year's Columbia River spring chinook run appears to be arriving very early and with more strength than predicted. As of April 8, 10,500 chinook had passed Bonneville Dam. This compared to only 3,526 chinook passing by that date in 1983.

The earlier run was evident by the success of the Root Feast fishery. In the two days of fishing 123 spring chinook were harvested for distribution to the Root Feasts. The excess fish is being stored in the tribal freezer for future ceremonies.
